AUSL REGULAR SEASON 101

RULES OF INTEREST

Run Rule: A regulation run-rule game shall be declared by the umpire if one team is ahead by eight or more runs after five or more equal innings.

- Complete innings must be played unless the home team reaches the eight-run lead while
 at bat in the last inning.
- Any hit that results in an eight-run lead by the home team (after 4 ½ innings) is considered
 a game-ending hit.
- Whenever the visiting team reaches the limit in the fifth inning or any inning thereafter, the home team must have its opportunity to bat in the bottom of the inning.

Extra Innings: If the score is tied after at least seven innings have been played, the following tiebreaker will be played to determine the winning team:

- Starting with the top of the eighth inning and in each half inning to follow, the offensive team shall begin its turn at bat with the player scheduled to bat ninth in that half inning being placed on second base.
- **Example:** If the No. 5 batter in the batting order is the lead-off batter, the No. 4 batter in the batting order will be placed on second base.

In-Game Conferences: Each team will be permitted seven (7) in-game conferences, which will include visits to the pitcher's circle by either a coach or player. In the event a game requires more than seven innings, teams will be given one (1) conference per extra inning.

Coach's Challenges: Each coach will be permitted two (2) video review challenges per game, which will be reviewed for a final decision. A challenge must be indicated by one of the two designated team representatives either verbally or visually before the next pitch is thrown, before all members of the infield have clearly vacated their positions and left fair territory, or before the umpires have left the field of play. A challenge is indicated visually by tapping the top of the head with one hand.

Umpires are also allowed to initiate a video review of any call in the reviewable plays list **once the game reaches the sixth inning**. Furthermore, the crew chief may initiate a review at any point during the game when a play is not properly covered by an umpire (i.e. uncovered or double covered with a different signal from each umpire).

The following plays can be reviewed:

- Regarding batted balls (any ball higher than the top of the foul pole when it leaves the field cannot have that aspect reviewed):
 - a. Deciding if a batted ball called fair is fair or foul
 - Deciding if a batted ball called foul should be a ground-rule double, home run or hit-by-pitch
 - c. Deciding if a batted ball is or is not a home run
- 2. Regarding pitched balls at the plate:
 - Deciding if a pitch ruled a dropped third strike was caught before the ball touched the ground
 - b. Deciding whether a live or dead ball should be changed to a foul ball
 - Deciding whether a foul ball should be changed to a foul tip only with no base runners, or if it would result in a third out
 - d. Deciding whether a batter is entitled to an award of first base per hit batter (by pitch) - whether the ball hit the batter, whether the ball was entirely in the batter's box, whether the batter made an attempt to get out of the way of the pitch when required, and/or whether the batter intentionally tried to get hit by the pitch
- 3. Spectator Interference
- 4. Obstruction and Interference (including collisions)
- 5. Deciding if malicious/flagrant contact occurred
 - Umpires may initiate this review without requiring a Coach's Challenge at any point in the game to ensure player safety
- Timing Plays (deciding whether a third out is made before the lead base runner touches home plate)
- Force/Tag Plays (plays involving all runners acquiring the bases before the defensive player's attempt to put the runner out at any base)
- Blocked or Dead Ball/Placement of Runners (deciding whether a ball not ruled blocked should be ruled blocked and the proper placement of runners [per rule book] after any blocked or dead ball call
- 9. Catch or No Catch (any situation)
- Runners leaving the base prior to the touch on a fly ball (tagging up), runners missing a base and runners leaving early on a pitch
 - The crew chief may not initiate a review of runners leaving early on a pitch; this
 review is only allowed by a coach's challenge
- 11. Any of the listed reviewable items if the action on the field results in a dead ball



The following criteria will be used for video review:

- 1. All equipment should be tested by appropriate personnel before each game.
- A ruling on the field will only be changed if there is indisputable video evidence to reverse the call. Absent that evidence, the original ruling on the field will stand.
- A review must be verbally or visually indicated before the next pitch, before the pitcher and all infielders have clearly vacated their normal fielding position and left fair territory, or the umpires leave the field of play.
- 4. Coaches have 30 seconds to verbally or visually lodge a challenge.
- The video review may be conducted on-site by the crew chief or by an off-field official at a centralized video review location.
- If video review is conducted on-site by the crew chief, the video review area shall not require an umpire to walk through spectators or dugouts to view the coverage. At least one umpire must remain on the field.
- 7. During the review, the defensive team shall maintain their position on the field and may warm up if desired. Offensive base runners and the on-deck hitter shall maintain their position. Other personnel shall remain in the dugout. Any defensive or offensive conferences will be charged as during any other part of the game.
- Once the review is completed, the crew chief will communicate the ruling to both head coaches and the official scorer using the following criteria. This should also be communicated to the broadcasting booth, if applicable, via the umpire who has a microphone.
 - a. Ruling on the field is upheld
 - b. Ruling on the field is changed

THE BOOK OF UNLIMITED

The Book of Unlimited was designed, handmade and bound for Athletes Unlimited and serves as a record keeper of its leagues, including the Athletes Unlimited Softball League. The book, which was handmade by Tikhon Verygyn in his studio in Kyiv, Ukraine, weighs nearly 25 pounds, measures approximately 12" by 18" and contains nearly 500 pages. The champion, along with all who competed, are inscribed into the book. In addition, The Book of Unlimited also contains a history of achievements in Athletes Unlimited, including stories, highlights and events.

The book opens during each season's Opening Ceremony and is closed after the champion's name is inscribed into the book during the Closing Ceremony. The tradition started during Athletes Unlimited Pro Softball's inaugural season in 2020.

2025 AUSL All-Star Cup

Parkway Bank Sports Complex, one of the premier softball facilities in the country, will serve as a home to the Athletes Unlimited Softball League during its inaugural 2025 regular season and All-Star Cup competitions.

The facility, which features an outdoor stadium with artificial turf and a 140,000 square foot dome, has been the primary location for Athletes Unlimited Softball since the organization's inception in 2020. Since opening in 2011, the venue has entertained a number of events, including Chicago Bandits (National Pro Fastpitch) softball and the Big East Conference (2014-19, 2022) and Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference Softball Tournaments.

During their nine-year stay at the facility, the Chicago Bandits claimed a pair of NPF regular season titles in addition to the 2011, 2015 and 2016 Cowles Cup championships.

At the time of its construction, Parkway Bank Sports Complex became the first facility of its kind built specifically for women's professional sports in the nation.

Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted:

2024 AU**X** Softball 2025 AUSL Regular Season

The home field for Wichita State University's softball team since 1998, Wilkins Stadium will once again welcome professional softball this summer by serving as a venue for the inaugural AUSL Regular Season.

The on-campus venue currently features seating for 1,000 fans and includes a locker room equipped with showers, coaches offices, team meeting rooms, umpire facilities, athletic training facilities, a ground-level press box, ticket booth, public restrooms and concession facilities.

The fan-friendly facility houses dugouts and bullpen areas for both teams in addition to batting cages behind the third base dugout. A synthetic turf surface was installed in the outfield, warning track, foul territory and apron areas in June 2023 to surround the dirt infield. In addition, four outfield decks, holding up to 25 spectators each, were completed before the start of the 2023 season.

The new surface was part of a multi-phase renovation for the facility, which will transform Wilkins Stadium into a state-of-the-art space for the Wichita State softball program.

The renovations will feature a 12,471 square-foot team complex, including a locker room, coaches locker room, classroom, team room, athletic training room, staff offices, work room, umpire locker rooms and laundry area. In addition, a new indoor practice facility with a full practice field and batting cages will also be constructed.

Upgrades to fan amenities will be part of the renovation, including an enclosed concourse, berm outfield seating, a new scoreboard with video capabilities, expanded seating areas, suites and press box, ticket office, concession stands, additional restrooms, merchandise store, fan netting and outfield suites.

A variety of fan seating options, including chairback seating, bleacher seating and berm outfield seating, will expand the stadium's capacity to 1,500 fans.

The outfield fence stands 215 feet from home plate to center field and 200 feet down the left and field lines. A fence extension will be added down the left field and right field lines to make the fence 17 feet high. A fair ball that hits off the fence extension, which runs 68 feet long, during a game is in play.

FROST STADIUM

Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted:

2025 AUSL Regular Season

Frost Stadium will welcome Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) action when the circuit visits Chattanooga, Tenn., in June.

Frost Stadium boasts the third-largest capacity in NCAA Division I softball with the ability to host 3,500 fans. The complex features bleachers down the first base and third base lines in addition to the outfield with 800 chairback seats behind home plate. The ballpark includes concession stands, restrooms, a pair of sky boxes, climate-controlled locker rooms, fenced-in bullpens and batting cages.

Serving as the home field for the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga Mocs, the softball team routinely ranks among national leaders in average attendance.

The playing field was updated in the fall of 2009 with artificial turf for the apron of the field from first base to third base. The Chattanooga logo is etched in foul territory down each base line and a stadium logo is featured behind home plate. The field bears the name of Jim Frost, who was involved in softball and baseball for nearly his entire adult life and coached in more than 1,500 youth events. He garnered ideas from traveling around the country in hopes of creating the best environment for the Mocs for years to come.

Originally named the "Stadium of 1,000 Dreams," Frost Stadium is nestled in the heart of the "capital" of fast-pitch softball in the Eastern United States. The facility hosted the Southern Conference Softball Championship 11 times, including three occasions in the last decade, and was spotlighted by hosting the SEC Softball Championship twice.

In 2000, Frost Stadium hosted the United States Women's National Team in an exhibition against the Mocs that resulted in a 2-0 victory for Team USA. The venue was set to host the national team again in April 2020 in front of an already sold-out crowd before it was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

McMURRY PARK

Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted:

2025 AUSL Regular Season

McMurry Park will serve as a host venue for the inaugural 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season as the circuit visits Sulphur, La., in June.

The venue features 13 youth baseball fields and four high school/college fields, including three turf fields for all-weather play. The Park holds up to 4,000 spectators and is highlighted by five concession stands, handicapped-accesible bathrooms, media areas and a pair of four-tunnel batting cages.

Originally created in 1960, the park has expanded to include six tennis courts, six pickleball courts, a gymnasium, a covered basketball pavilion and multiple covered picnic areas.

McMurry Park, which has been home to the Louisiana Games Baseball Tournament since 2012 and the Dixie Boys Super World Series, previously hosted the U.S. Women's National Softball Team during an exhibition tour prior to the 2008 Beijing Olympics. The contest, which ended in a 2-0 victory for Team USA against the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns, produced the largest crowd for a softball game in Louisiana state history.

Moveable fencing will be put in place for the AUSL contests. Field dimensions down each foul line will stand at 210 feet, while the center field wall will be 230 feet from home plate.



LOVE'S FIELD

Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted:

2025 AUSL Regular Season

Love's Field, one of the newest venues in Division I softball, serves as a host site for the inaugural 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season when the circuit visits Norman, Okla., in June.

The home of the University of Oklahoma softball program, Love's Field can welcome up to 4,200 fans, which is the highest capacity for an on-campus softball facility in the country. The venue includes a 10,669 square-foot indoor training center, locker rooms, training rooms, meeting rooms, equipment rooms and lounges. The facility also has a recognition area to highlight the Sooners' many national championships, All-Americans and other accomplishments.

Love's Field opened in March 2024 in tune with Women's History Month after a \$37 million project resulted in the largest privately-fundraised female-specific facility project in college athletics history behind over 1,100 donors, including the Love's chain of retailers.

In just its second year of competition, Love's Field has served as a host site for the NCAA Norman Regional in each of the last two seasons, as well as the 2024 and 2025 NCAA Super Regionals for the seven-time NCAA champion Sooners.

The outfield fence stands 225 feet from home plate to center field and 200 feet down the left and right field lines.



CONNIE CLAUSSEN FIELD

Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted:

2025 AUSL Regular Season

The first on-campus home for the University of Omaha softball program, Connie Claussen Field will welcome the Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) in July.

Named after Athletic Director Emerita Connie Claussen, who brought women's athletics to the University in 1969, the field opened on March 19, 2021. The venue runs adjacent to Tal Anderson Field, the home of Omaha baseball, and is attached by a raised concourse which forms Maverick Park.

The venue boasts 650 fixed seats behind home plate as well as berm seating down each baseline for additional fans and includes a state-of-the-art artificial surface.

Connie Claussen Field also features a press box, concession areas and restrooms. A 26-foot by 19-foot videoboard highlights the facility behind the center field wall.



HUSKY SOFTBALL STADIUM

Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted:

2025 AUSL Regular Season

The long-time home for the University of Washington softball program, Husky Softball Stadium hosts the Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) during its inaugural 2025 season in July.

The 1,500-seat venue holds a combination of chairback, theatre and bleacher seating around the perimeter of the field. Spectator attendance at Washington softball games rank among the best in the nation each season at a facility which offers concession stands, restrooms and handicap accessibility.

Originally built in 1994, Husky Softball Stadium faces out over Lake Washington toward Mt. Rainier and has served as a host site for NCAA Regional play six times, in addition to the NCAA Super Regionals in 2023.

With multiple renovation projects since its opening, Husky Softball Stadium updated the locker rooms in 2014, which now features a 600-square foot open layout with individual player lockers. In 2016, the venue installed a state-of-the-art video board behind the right field wall.



DUMKE FAMILY SOFTBALL STADIUM

Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted:

2025 AUSL Regular Season

Home to the University of Utah softball program since 2013, Dumke Family Softball Stadium will welcome the Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) in July.

The complex features seating for up to 1,410 fans, including covered armchair seats and bleachers behind the home plate area. Temporary bleacher seating can be placed in the left field berm behind the fence to allow for more spectators. The lighted facility also includes indoor and outdoor batting cages in addition to outdoor pitching cages. The dugouts are equipped with restrooms and athletic training rooms are located within the venue.

The natural grass field extends 235 feet to center field from home plate and 225 feet to each of the foul poles. A grass berm beyond the center field wall allows fans to sit close to the action

Dumke Family Softball Stadium set its attendance record on May 28, 2023, as a crowd of 3,093 spectators watched the Utes defeat San Diego State in the NCAA Super Regional series. It was the venue's first time hosting a Super Regional, while the complex has also served as a host site for the 2017 and 2023 NCAA Salt Lake City Regionals.





Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted:

2025 AUSL Regular Season

The home field for the Round Rock Express, the Triple-A affiliate of the Texas Rangers, Dell Diamond will serve as a host site for the inaugural 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season in July.

The field opened in 2000 as the home site for the then-Double-A Express and was constructed on former farm land. Dell, a tech company whose headquarters are in Round Rock, Texas, contracted the naming rights for the \$25 million facility.

The ballpark has 8,631 permanent seats, including 75 handicapped seats, and the outfield lawn allows for nearly 3,000 additional fans. The natural grass playing surface was replaced in 2016

In addition to Express games, the facility also hosts the Texas high school state baseball tournament every year with the University Interscholastic League. Round Rock hosted the 2001 Double-A All-Star Game, which saw 12,046 fans in attendance for a National League 8-3 victory against the American League.


Outside of baseball, the venue was the home field for the Austin Elite of Major League Rugby in 2019, while the Americas Rugby Championship used Dell Diamond for a match between Canada and the United States during the 2016 tour. Prior to the venue's resurfacing, Traxxas Monster Truck Destruction Tour used Dell Diamond in 2016.

Several colleges have played baseball games at Dell Diamond, including Texas during the 2007 campaign when the Longhorns' home stadium underwent renovations.

In pop culture, Dell Diamond was featured in an episode of "The Simple Life" with Nicole Richie and Paris Hilton in 2004 and was transformed into a set for the fourth season of "Fear the Walking Dead" between the 2017 and 2018 Express seasons.

Dell Diamond routinely ranks as one of the top venues in Minor League Baseball and also serves as an entertainment complex that hosts concerts, expos and festivals. In a unique feature of the field, fans seated in the first row behind home plate are closer to home plate than the pitcher's mound.

Moveable fencing will be put in place for the AUSL contests. Field dimensions down each foul line will stand at 210 feet with the center field wall being 230 feet from home plate.



RHOADS STADIUM

Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted:

2025 AUSL Regular Season

The John and Ann Rhoads Softball Stadium will serve as a host site for the inaugural 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season and the first AUSL Championship Series in July.

One of the largest on-campus softball facilities in the nation, Rhoads Stadium was constructed in 2000 and holds a seating capacity of 3,940 spectators. The venue has hosted an impressive 22 NCAA Regional series, including the 2025 NCAA Tuscaloosa Regional, along with 12 NCAA Super Regional rounds. The home of the University of Alabama's Crimson Tide, the complex has hosted the SEC Tournament three times, including the 2021 postseason event.

Alabama has set several NCAA attendance records since opening Rhoads Stadium, which is the largest capacity softball venue outside of ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City and Love's Field in Norman, Okla. In May 2017, the Crimson Tide battled against Auburn in front of 4,015 spectators to set a facility record. During the three-game series, more than 12,000 fans came through the turnstiles.

The \$2.2 million venue has undergone several renovation projects since opening its doors 25 years ago with the most recent updates including additional ticket gates, concession areas and restrooms. The venue added an expanded clubhouse with new locker rooms, an expanded training room and player lounge, team video rooms and a lobby following the 2010 season.

The clubhouse is connected to the complex's indoor practice facility, which holds several batting cages and a bullpen. A 2011 renovation expanded the seating capacity to its current number after adding tiered seating in right field that also includes tables and a drink rail.

The centerfield wall is set 220 feet from home plate, while each foul pole stands 200 feet away down the left and right field lines.

Lawrie, a member of the AU Pro Softball broadcast team since the inaugural 2020 season, was a two-time USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year and Honda Sports Award winner in her college career at the University of Washington. She also led Canada to the Bronze medal at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics in addition to winning two Cowles Cup titles in her professional career. Mendoza, who also serves as an advisor to the AUSL, enters her first season as a member of the broadcast team. A two-time Olympian with Team USA and four-time First-Team NFCA All-America selection at Stanford, Mendoza has enjoyed a record-setting broadcasting career that includes becoming the first female to work as an analyst for nationally-televised Major League Baseball games in addition to being part of the Little League Baseball® World Series broadcast team since 2016.

A two-time All-America pitcher at Arizona, Fowler joined the AU Pro Softball broadcast team in 2023. The Tucson, Ariz., native hurled four no-hitters for the Wildcats, including a perfect game, and was a finalist for the 2010 USA Softball Player of the Year award. She was inducted into the Arizona Sports Hall of Fame in 2024.

Watley, a two-time Olympian with Team USA and AUSL advisor, made her Athletes Unlimited debut last summer. A four-time First-Team NFCA All-America selection at UCLA, the Irvine, Calif., native propelled Team USA to a Gold medal in the 2004 Athens Olympics before claiming the Silver medal in the 2008 Beijing Olympics.

AUSL Senior Reporter **Savanna Collins** also joins the broadcast team this summer, providing in-game updates from the field. She has also been a member of the broadcast teams for Athletes Unlimited Pro Basketball, Athletes Unlimited Pro Softball and Athletes Unlimited Pro Volleyball.

Kim Ng will serve as the first commissioner in Athletes Unlimited Softball League history after being named to the position on April 16, 2025.



Kim Ng, a trailblazing executive and the first woman to serve as General Manager of a major American men's professional sports team, was named as the first Commissioner in the history of the Athletes Unlimited Softball League on April 16, 2025.

Ng, who joined Athletes Unlimited in the summer of 2024 as a senior advisor, will guide the new league into its first season following a long and distinguished career in Major League Baseball.

"Kim's intellect, experience and connection to players and business leaders alike clearly make her uniquely qualified for this role and the way she has galvanized and inspired the entire softball community behind the AUSL over the past year has been remarkable," said Athletes Unlimited CEO Jon Patricof. "The AUSL marks a bold new step forward for softball, and under Kim's leadership, we are confident it will soon join the ranks of the leading pro sports leagues."

Ng joined the Athletes Unlimited staff after spending four years as the general manager for the Miami Marlins. Under her leadership, the Marlins posted the fourth-best winning percentage in franchise history during the 2023 campaign while earning the first full-season postseason berth in 20 years.

In 2021, Ng was recognized as the Best Hire in Sports by Sports Business Journal along with being named Trailblazer of the Year by Baseball America. She was also recognized as a Game Changer by the Asia Society in addition to receiving the Billie Jean King Leadership Award from the Women's Sports Foundation and the Lou Gehrig Sports Award from the ALS Association of Greater New York.

Prior to her time with the Marlins, Ng served as Senior Vice President of Baseball Operations with Major League Baseball for nine years and was the highest-ranking Asian-American female baseball executive. She directed international baseball operations while working with the front offices of the league's 30 clubs along with many other baseball leagues and entities

In addition, she guided a team which set policies for international signing rules, established MLB's first system for registering international players for signing, and managed protocols for signing international players.

Ng also focused efforts on growing the game of baseball while anchoring the league's efforts in improving quality of play, caliber of talent and rate of participation for amateur baseball around the world. She also supervised the league's playing initiatives for girls and women while serving on MLB's Diversity Pipeline Advisory Committee.

Ng started her baseball career with the Chicago White Sox as an intern in 1990 before rising to the position of Assistant Director of Baseball Operations. After serving as the Director of Waivers and Records for the American League in 1997, she joined the New York Yankees as Assistant General Manager from 1998-2001.

When she was hired by the Yankees, Ng was the youngest person in the league to hold that title at 29 years old in addition to being just the second woman to be an Assistant General Manager with an MLB club.

In 2002, Ng joined the Los Angeles Dodgers staff as Vice President and Assistant General Manager, a position she held for nine years. Her primary duties included assisting in player transactions, trades and free agent signings, while also overseeing the team's arbitration efforts. She also oversaw the organization's pro scouting, medical and video departments.

Ng also served as the Dodgers' interim Farm Director in 2004, overseeing all player development

Ng was part of nine combined postseason appearances during her tenure with the White Sox, Yankees and Dodgers, including six League Championship Series berths. The Yankees won three World Series titles during her four years with the organization.

Ng has received many honors and awards during her historic career. She has appeared on Forbes' Most Influential Minorities in Sports and Most Influential Women in Sports lists along with being recognized on Adweek's Most Powerful Women in Sports group. She was recognized as one of InStyle Magazine's Badass 50 Women in addition to being included on the list of the South Florida Business Journal's Power Leaders.

A graduate of the University of Chicago with a degree in public policy, Ng was a four-year letter winner for the softball team.





Sam Fischer's playing career may have come to a close following the 2024 Athletes Unlimited Pro Softball Championship Season, but she is still making an impact in Athletes Unlimited by serving as the Manager, Softball Operations during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League campaign in 2025.

Fischer, who competed in all eight Athletes Unlimited Pro Softball seasons, closed her AU Pro Softball career as one of seven players to appear in 100 or more games between AU \mathbf{X} and Championship Season play. She finished with a .333 career batting average, while her 86 combined hits rank eighth on the league's all-time career chart.

In addition, Fischer collected 57 runs batted in during her 106-game career, which are tied for fifth in AU Pro Softball history. The Simi Valley, Calif., product also scored 36 runs in her career while registering 14 home runs, two triples and 10 doubles.

Fischer enjoyed her best year of AU Pro Softball competition in 2022, earning an eighth place showing on the final AU \mathbf{X} leaderboard before securing seventh place during the league's Championship Season. She authored a .375 batting average during 12 AUX contests while adding two home runs with a career-high 11 runs batted in before adding three home runs and 10 runs batted in over 15 Championship Season fixtures.

In 2023, Fischer secured a 13th place finish during the AUX competition before posting a 12th place showing on the final Championship Season leaderboard. She ended the AUX season with a .368 batting mark after compiling 14 hits over 10 games, before hitting at a .273 clip in Championship Season play with 12 hits, including two home runs and two doubles.

Fischer spent her final two years serving as the chairperson of Athletes Unlimited Pro Softball's Player Executive Committee, providing leadership over the league's five-person group. Fischer played in 81 games over two seasons with the Akron Racers of National Pro East-

Fischer played in 81 games over two seasons with the Akron Racers of National Pro Fastpitch, belting 19 home runs with 51 runs batted in. She signed with Scrap Yard Fastpitch in 2018 and also played two years in the Japan Diamond League with the Toda Medics. Fischer also enjoyed a lengthy career with Team USA, competing with the squad from 2012-15 along with a stint with the Team USA Women's Elite squad in 2016. She fashioned a .330 batting average with eight home runs and 31 runs batted in during her time with the national team while earning a pair of Gold medals at the World Cup of Softball and Japan Cup in 2015.

Team USA also collected a Gold medal at the 2014 World Cup of Softball with Fischer on its roster. She also earned a pair of Silver medals with Team USA at the 2012 and 2014 ISF World Championships.

A four-year letter winner at Loyola Marymount from 2009-12, Fischer was the first player in program history to earn First-Team All-Pacific Coast Softball Conference recognition four times while claiming a spot on the NFCA All-America Second Team during her senior season after leading NCAA Division I with a .492 batting average.

The two-time PCSC Coastal Division Player of the Year finished her career as the Lions' all-time leader in home runs (65), runs batted in (172), total bases (495), batting average (.387), slugging percentage (.786), on-base percentage (.494), runs scored (194), doubles (52) and walks (127).

Inducted into the Loyola Marymount Sports Hall of Fame in 2019, Fischer also entered the West Coast Conference's Hall of Honor in March 2023 and had her No. 52 jersey retired by Loyola Marymount.





Since starting her softball career at the age of five years old, Jennie Finch has enjoyed legendary success at the college, professional and international levels. Now, one of the greatest pitchers of all-time aims to bring that success to the Athletes Unlimited Softball League as an advisor during its inaugural season.

Finch's record-setting career began at the University of Arizona where she was a dominant force in the circle for the Wildcats from 1999-2002. A three-time NFCA First-Team All-America selection, Finch also earned the Honda Award for Softball following her junior and senior seasons in addition to a pair of Pac-10 Conference Pitcher of the Year certificates.

Finch amassed an impressive 119-16 record in the circle during her college career, while her .881 career win percentage ranks fifth in NCAA Division I history. She ranks 10th in program history with a 1.09 career earned run average, while her 1,028 career strikeouts are good for third place on the Wildcats' career chart.

In addition to her many contributions to the Arizona pitching record book, Finch also owns the longest winning streak by a pitcher in NCAA Division I history after claiming 60 consecutive victories from April 29, 2000 to April 6, 2002.

During her junior season, the La Mirada, Calif., product piloted the Wildcats to the sixth national title in program history. She finished the campaign with a perfect 32-0 record, which stands as the best single-season mark by a pitcher in NCAA Division I history, while recording a 0.54 earned run average with 279 strikeouts over 207.0 innings.

Honored as the Most Outstanding Player at the 2001 NCAA Women's College World Series, Finch guided the Wildcats to a perfect 4-0 record, including back-to-back 1-0 wins over Stanford and UCLA to secure the title.

Finch, who also threw eight no-hitters with 64 shutouts in her college career, was equally as productive as a hitter. She authored a .301 career batting average with 50 home runs and 195 runs batted in while appearing in 270 total games.

Finch's success carried into the professional level where she compiled a 35-8 record with 26 complete games and 15 shutouts during five seasons with the Chicago Bandits of National Pro Fastpitch.

Honored as co-recipient of the 2005 NPF Pitcher of the Year award, Finch posted a perfect 14-0 record with a 0.88 earned run average and 114 strikeouts in her inaugural professional season. She also hit .309 with six home runs and 22 runs batted in.

In her final season with the Bandits, Finch secured All-NPF Team status after boasting a 6-4 record and 80 strikeouts across 28 appearances. She also contributed a .266 batting average at the plate with eight extra-base hits, including six doubles, one triple and one home run.

A member of the Chicago Bandits' 2008 NPF Championship Team, Finch ranks fourth in league with a 1.11 career earned run average, while her 382 career strikeouts are good for 10th place on the all-time ledger. She also holds the league record with a 0.68 WHIP.

Finch also enjoyed a successful career at the international level, earning a pair of Olympic medals with Team USA. She helped the United States win the Gold medal in the 2004 Athens Games, spinning a 2-0 record with 13 strikeouts over 8.0 innings.

In addition, Finch aided Team USA's efforts in winning the Silver medal at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing. She contributed 4.0 no-hit innings in an 11-0 victory over Venezuela before adding 5.0 shutout frames in a 7-0 triumph against Chinese Taipei.

Finch, who competed for Team USA in 1998 along with a stint from 2002-10, was honored as the USA Softball Female Athlete of the Year in 2009. She also helped Team USA claim the Gold medal at the 2002, 2006 and 2010 World Championships along with a pair of Gold medals at the Pan American Games in 2003 and 2007.

A native of Sulphur, La., Finch was inducted into the National Softball Hall of Fame in 2016. Finch, who started pitching at age 8, is married to Casey Daigle, a former Major League Baseball pitcher who played for the Arizona Diamondbacks and the Houston Astros. The couple has three children - Ace, Diesel and Paisley.





Jessica Mendoza, a two-time Olympian and four-time NFCA All-America First Team honoree, has certainly made her mark as one of the greatest players in softball history. She hopes to make even more history with the Athletes Unlimited Softball League, serving as an advisor during its inaugural season.

The only player in Stanford history to earn First-Team All-America status four times, Mendoza also holds the honor of being one of two Cardinal student-athletes to ever secure four All-America citations. She also collected First-Team All-Pac-12 Conference plaudits every year and was honored as the league's Player of the Year in 2000.

Mendoza's name is etched thoroughly throughout the Stanford single-season and career record books. She holds the top spot on the Cardinal's career charts for batting average (.416), hits (327), home runs (50), slugging percentage (.719), runs scored (230) and stolen bases (86).

In addition, Mendoza ranks third in school history with 70 career doubles and 188 career runs batted in, while her 786 at-bats are good for second on the all-time ledger.

Mendoza, the only player in Stanford history to hit over .400 in three seasons during a career, established the program single-season standard during her sophomore year when she fashioned a .475 batting average. She also set a program record by scoring 70 runs during the 2001 season while appearing in a school-record 71 games.

Mendoza also owns the distinction of being one of two players in Arizona history with 90 or more hits in a single season when she tallied 94 hits in her sophomore year.

During her four-year career, the Cardinal posted a 183-79-1 record with four NCAA regional appearances, including the program's first-ever Women's College World Series berth in 2001. Led by Mendoza, Stanford won a school-record 54 games, including victories over LSU and California in the Women's College World Series.

After closing her college career, Mendoza went on to play four seasons in National Pro Fastpitch. She opened her professional career with the Arizona Heat in 2005, fashioning a .491 batting average with 29 hits, including five doubles and eight home runs.

In 2010, Mendoza returned to the professional ranks and spent the next three seasons with the USSSA Pride. She guided the Pride to the 2010 Cowles Cup title after hitting .284 with seven home runs and 28 runs batted in.

Over her four NPF seasons, Mendoza posted a .360 batting average to rank fourth on the league's all-time chart. She also belted 34 home runs with 130 runs batted in, while adding 114 runs scored.

A two-time Olympian, Mendoza helped the United States win the Gold medal at the 2004 Athens Games by hitting .250 (5-for-20) with five runs scored and five runs batted in. She also helped Team USA secure the Silver medal four years later in Beijing.

In addition to her success at the Olympics, Mendoza helped Team USA win the Gold medal at the World Championship in 2002, 2006 and 2010. She hit .313 during the 2002 event with eight runs scored and seven runs batted in before contributing five home runs with 16 RBI in 2006

Mendoza also owns Gold medals from the 2003 and 2007 Pan American Games along with the 2001 U.S. Cup. She was honored as the USA Softball Female Athlete of the Year in 2006 and was inducted into the National Softball Hall of Fame in 2019.

Setting records is not something Mendoza has done just on the softball diamond. In 2015, she became the first woman to serve as an analyst for nationally-televised Major League Baseball games during an edition of Monday Night Baseball on ESPN. She later became the first female analyst for a nationally-televised MLB postseason contest by calling the American League Wild Card game on ESPN.

In October 2020, Mendoza became the first female World Series analyst on any national broadcast when she was a member of ESPN Radio's coverage.

In addition to her Major League Baseball experience, Mendoza has been a member of the broadcast team for ESPN and ABC's coverage of the Little League Baseball World Series since 2016. She has also provided analysis for ESPN's coverage at the NCAA Women's College World Series since 2007.

Mendoza is also currently in her fourth season as a member of the broadcast team for the Los Angeles Dodgers' television coverage.

A native of Camarillo, Calif., Mendoza received her bachelor's degree in American studies from Stanford in 2002 before earning a master's degree in social sciences in education in 2003





A name synonymous with softball in the United States, Cat Osterman returns to Athletes Unlimited as an advisor to the Athletes Unlimited Softball League in addition to serving as the General Manager of the Volts during the inaugural 2025 season.

Renowned as one of the top pitchers in the sport's history, Osterman competed in three Olympic Games while serving as a member of the United States National Team from 2001-10 and 2019-21. She guided Team USA to the Gold medal in the 2004 Athens Olympics with two victories and a save while serving as the youngest player on the roster.

Team USA also claimed a Silver medal in the 2008 Beijing Olympics and the 2020 Tokyo Olympics with Osterman anchoring the pitching staff. Over her 20 seasons playing at softball's highest level, Osterman fashioned an impressive 74-5 record in the circle with a 0.44 earned run average and 1,030 strikeouts over 519.0 innings.

The only three-time winner of the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award, Osterman had a historic playing career at Texas from 2002-06. She led the Longhorns to three Women's College World Series appearances in 2003, 2005 and 2006 and earned a pair of WCWS All-Tournament Team certificates. The four-time NFCA All-America performer claimed the sport's highest honor as the 2005 and 2006 Honda Award winner for softball and was honored as the 2005 and 2006 ESPY Award winner as the Top Collegiate Female Athlete.

Osterman still holds several Longhorns' career pitching records, including wins (136), earned run average (0.51), shutouts (85), no-hitters (20), perfect games (7), innings pitched (1,105.2), appearances (180) and strikeouts (2,265). She also holds the distinction of being the only student-athlete in softball history to lead the nation in earned run average multiple times, doing so three times.

With a 14.34 strikeout-per-seven-inning average, Osterman still holds the NCAA top mark after nearly 20 years. She held opposing hitters to just a .096 clip across her collegiate career

A four-time Big 12 Conference Pitcher of the Year honoree, Osterman still owns league records in career wins, ERA, strikeouts, no-hitters, perfect games and shutouts. She also claimed the 2006 NCAA Today's Top VIII Award, which was awarded to the top eight senior student-athletes in the country. She is one of just five pitchers in NCAA Division I history to record at least 100 career victories, 1,000 career strikeouts and a career ERA under 1.00.

In addition to her success in the circle, Osterman also excelled academically at Texas and garnered Third-Team CoSIDA Academic All-America® honors as a sophomore in addition to three Academic All-Big 12 Conference Team citations. She will be inducted into the College Sports Communicators Academic All-America® Hall of Fame in June 2025.

After graduating from Texas, Osterman was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2006 National Pro Fastpitch (NPF) league draft by the Connecticut Brakettes, but never played with the team. She spent two seasons with the Rockford Thunder, earning MVP honors at the NPF Championship Series after leading Rockford to the league title over the USSSA Pride.

Osterman went on to lead the USSSA Pride to three NPF championships over six seasons. She earned All-NPF status six times, including a pair of Pitcher of the Year certificates, and finished as the league's all-time leader with a 0.91 career earned run average. In addition, Osterman ranks second in league history with 1,260 strikeouts.

In addition to her playing career, Osterman spent six years as an assistant coach at Texas State, helping the Bobcats rise to the top of the Sun Belt Conference. Texas State, which reached the NCAA Tournament three times during Osterman's tenure, closed the 2018 season with a 43-16 record and the regular season and tournament titles, marking the program's first championships since joining the league.

With Osterman in the dugout, the Bobcats' pitching staff posted a sub-2.00 earned run average three times over six seasons.

Before joining the Texas State staff, Osterman spent three seasons as an assistant coach at St. Edwards University. The Hilltoppers compiled a 98-69 record and an appearance in the NCAA DIvision II Super Regionals. St. Edwards won the Heartland Conference Tournament in 2012, while climbing to a runner-up finish in the league postseason in 2013 and 2014.

Osterman began her coaching career at DePaul from 2008-10, helping the Blue Demons earn three Big East Championships and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances.

No stranger to Athletes Unlimited Pro Softball, Osterman earned the inaugural 2020 AU Pro Softball Championship Season title with a league-record 2,408 leaderboard points. She garnered 14 wins in 23 career appearances and still holds league standards for earned run average (1.64) and innings (124.0), while her 145 strikeouts are second on the all-time chart.



Osterman was 16-8 as a captain over two seasons, including a league-record 10 wins during the inaugural campaign.

Osterman was enshrined in the Texas Sports Hall of Fame in 2013 before securing a spot in the World of Little League® Hall of Excellence. She was the fourth female and first softball inductee to join the Hall of Excellence.

Osterman earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from Texas in 2007 before securing a master's degree in educational and counseling psychology with a concentration in positive coaching from Missouri in 2015.

Osterman, who is married to Joey Ashley, has a daughter named Jaycee and a step-daughter named Bracken.



From her days with UCLA and Team USA to her career in National Pro Fastpitch, Natasha Watley could be considered one of the greatest hitters in the history of softball. She hopes to impart her greatness on the Athletes Unlimited Softball League as an advisor during its inaugural season.

One of three players in UCLA history to earn four First-Team NFCA All-America citations, Watley earned the starting assignment in all 251 games of her college career from 2000-03. She earned First-Team All-Pac-10 Conference distinction in all four years and was recognized as the league' Player of the Year following her senior season.

A two-time NCAA Women's College World Series All-Tournament Team selection, Watley led the Bruins to the Women's College World Series during each of her four years. UCLA amassed a 28-6 record in the Women's College World Series and won the 2003 title.

Watley finished her award-winning college career with a .450 batting average, the second-highest mark in program history. In addition, she holds the UCLA career records for at-bats (878), hits (395), runs scored (252), triples (21) and stolen bases (158).

A native of Irvine, California, Watley ranks second in UCLA history with 252 runs scored. She also contributed 15 home runs, including 10 homers during her senior season, while driving in 135 runs. She hit .400 or better during each of her four seasons, including a career-best .485 mark as a junior, and paced the Bruins in hits and triples during all four seasons.

Watley opened her career in 2000 by hitting .426 with 80 hits, including 10 doubles, four triples and one home run, while swiping 32 bases in 37 attempts. She set the UCLA single-game record with four stolen bases against Canisius on May 18, 2000, during the NCAA Regionals.

During her sophomore campaign, Watley registered at least one hit in 32 consecutive games from March 2-April 29, 2001, establishing the longest streak in UCLA history. It also stands as the seventh-longest run in NCAA Division I history.

In addition to her consistency at the plate, Watley was a menace on the basepaths by establishing a UCLA single-season standard with 52 stolen bases in 56 tries. She also scored 5 runs over 68 games to set another school record.

Watley enjoyed her best season at the plate during her junior season, fashioning a .485 batting average while setting a new UCLA record with 112 hits, including 14 doubles, seven triples and two home runs. Her 112 hits rank seventh on the NCAA's all-time Division I single-season ledger.

As a senior, Watley guided the Bruins to the NCAA Division I title by recording a .481 batting average with a career-high 10 home runs and 53 runs batted in. Honored as the 2003 Honda Award for Softball winner, she also became the third softball player in UCLA history to win the Honda Broderick Cup as the nation's top overall female collegiate student-athlete.

Watley went on to enjoy a record-setting career in National Pro Fastpitch and stands as the league's all-time leader with a .394 batting average. She opened her professional career with the NY/NJ Juggernaut in 2005 before spending the 2006 campaign with the Philadelphia Force.

Watley returned to NPF competition in 2010 with the USSSA Pride and was a member of the squad for the following six seasons. She guided the Pride to three NPF titles, including back-to-back crowns in 2013 and 2014.

Over eight career NPF seasons, Watley accumulated 373 hits and 84 stolen bases, which both rank third on the league's all-time chart. Her nine career triples also ranks second in league history.

In addition to her NPF career, Watley played professionally overseas in Japan and captured five Japan Softball League titles with Team Toyota before retiring in 2017.

As legendary as her college and professional careers were, Watley's international career also provided just as much success. She was a two-time Olympian, guiding the United States to the Gold medal at the 2004 Athens Games in addition to a Silver medal at the 2008 Beijing Games.

Watley also piloted Team USA to the Gold medal at the 2002, 2006 and 2010 Women's World Championship. She was also a member of four championship teams at the World Cup of Softball (2005, 2006, 2007, 2009).

Watley also owns a pair of Gold medals in Pan American Games competition. In the 2003 event, she hit .292 (7-for-24) with four runs batted in and five stolen bases before adding a 4-for-11 performance at the plate with a team-high five runs scored in 2007.



A two-time Hall of Fame inductee, Watley earned a spot in the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame in 2014 before joining the National Softball Hall of Fame in 2020. She earned her bachelor's degree from UCLA before adding a master's degree in sports business from Saint Leo University.

With over three decades of experience at the highest levels of softball and baseball, Jenny Dalton-Hill leads the front office of the Bandits as general manager during the inaugural 2025 Athletes Unlimited Pro Softball (AUSL) season.

Dalton-Hill heads the Bandits front office while also serving in her second stint as a member of USA Baseball's Board of Directors. She previously held the role from 2012-20 before reclaiming a spot on the Board in 2022.

Dalton-Hill has also served as a coach for the inaugural USA Baseball Girls Camp and was a part of the Women's National Team Development Program in 2011, 2014 and 2021. In 2012, she guided the U.S. Women's National Team to an International Baseball Federation (IBF) Women's Baseball World Cup Silver medal as an assistant coach.

One of the most prolific hitters in Arizona program history, Dalton-Hill piloted the Wildcats to a 232-26 (.899) record and three NCAA Division I titles in her four seasons from 1993-96. She was a three-time NFCA All-America selection and garnered Pac-10 Conference Player of the Year distinction in 1996.

Dalton-Hill, the 1996 Honda Award recipient, also became the first Wildcat to claim the league's Triple Crown as she led the Pac-10 with a .469 batting average, 25 home runs and 109 RBI during her final season at Arizona.

A career .412 hitter with the Wildcats, Dalton-Hill finished her college career with 76 home runs, 291 hits and a remarkable 328 runs batted in, which remains the NCAA Division I record after nearly 30 years. She is one of six players in NCAA Division I history to drive in 300 or more runs.

Dalton-Hill, who was inducted into the Arizona Sports Hall of Fame in 2001, joined the collegiate softball coaching ranks as a volunteer assistant coach at her alma mater during the 1997 season when the Wildcats collected their fifth NCAA crown. She also had a two-year stint as an assistant coach at Kentucky.

In addition to her standout softball career, Dalton-Hill competed on the baseball diamond playing for the Colorado Silver Bullets under MLB Hall of Famer Phil Niekro during the team's final season in 1997. She batted .300 and guided the Silver Bullets to the only winning season in team history with a 23-22 record. The team is enshrined in Cooperstown as part of the National Baseball Hall of Fame.

Dalton-Hill went on to join Team USA in the 2010 Women's Baseball World Cup, helping the squad earn a Bronze medal with a 15-5 victory against Venezuela. She led Team USA in the Bronze medal game by going 2-for-2 with three runs batted in.

In 2022, Dalton-Hill became just the seventh woman to be inducted to the Little League Hall of Excellence. She was a part of the 1989 Senior League Softball World Series, advancing to the championship game.

Dalton-Hill has worked with ESPN as a softball analyst since 2013, including the Women's College World Series and the Little League Softball® World Series. She was also part of the 7Innings Podcast that features collegiate softball and the journey to the Women's College World Series.

Dalton-Hill's high school alma mater, Glendale High School, renamed its softball field (Dalton Field) in her honor in 2005 along with retiring her jersey number.

Stacey Nuveman Deniz embarks on her first season as the head coach of the Bandits during the inaugural 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season.

A member of the San Diego State coaching staff since the 2009 season, Nuveman Deniz was named the fifth head coach in program history on June 8, 2021. Since taking the helm of the Aztecs, she has guided the program to a 147-72 (.671) record in her first four seasons, including four consecutive 30-win campaigns, and three Mountain West Conference Tournament championships.

In 2025, Nuveman Deniz's squad finished with a 38-19 record and won the Mountain West Tournament for the third consecutive season, while securing its fourth straight NCAA Tournament appearance. After opening the tournament with a 3-0 loss against Fresno State, the Aztecs bounced back with four consecutive wins, including a pair of triumphs over Fresno

A total of six San Diego State student-athletes earned a spot on the All-Mountain West Teams, including Quinn Waiki, who became the first freshman in league history to earn Defensive Player of the Year honors. Cece Cellura and Bella Espinoza garnered First-Team All-Mountain West status, while Julie Holcomb, Jade Ignacio and Grace Uribe were named to the Second Team.

Nuveman Deniz secured her second regular season Mountain West championship with a 13-4 victory against UNLV on the final day of the 2024 season. She earned Mountain West Coach of the Year distinction for the second time in three years, while the Aztecs received an entry into the NCAA Tournament field for the third straight season.

In 2023, the Aztecs finished 39-17 and secured their first Mountain West Tournament championship since 2006 after controlling second place in the regular season standings. San $\,$ Diego State earned its first appearance in the NCAA Super Regionals after posting a trio of victories against Liberty and Grand Canyon in the Los Angeles Regional.

The Aztecs finished the season as the 18th-ranked team in the nation, while Nuveman Deniz and her staff claimed NFCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year accolades.

Nuveman Deniz was honored as the 2022 Mountain West Coach of the Year after piloting the Aztecs to their first league regular season crown since 2014. San Diego State finished with a 39-16 record and earned its first NCAA Tournament berth since 2015, advancing to the final game of the Arizona State regional.

Under Nuveman Deniz's guidance, utility player Mac Barbara became the first Aztec to garner three straight NFCA All-Region citations after receiving First-Team notice from 2022-24. She was also the first player in program history to earn multiple Mountain West Player of the Year certificates after receiving the league's top honor in 2022 and 2024.

Before taking over the reins of the San Diego State program, Nuveman Deniz spent 13 seasons on the staff as an assistant coach from 2009-21, including serving as the associate $\frac{1}{2}$ head coach from 2013-21. During her time as an assistant coach, the Aztecs earned seven consecutive NCAA Tournament berths from 2009-15.

In addition to her head coaching experience with the Aztecs, Nuveman Deniz spent the 2018 campaign with the Chicago Bandits and guided the team to the National Pro Fastpitch

Nuveman Deniz was named as an assistant coach for USA Softball for the 2025-28 quad, which will include national team camps and international events. She will be one of three members of the staff with AUSL ties, joining Volts Head Coach Kelly Kretschman and league

Nuveman Deniz followed a stellar collegiate career by joining the U.S. Women's National Team for the 2000 Sydney Olympics where Team USA claimed a Gold medal. She was the youngest player on the 2000 roster but made major contributions by tallying 10 home runs and a .365 batting average during the team's pre-Olympic tour.

Nuveman Deniz also led Team USA to the Gold medal at the 2004 Olympics after hitting .313 with a pair of home runs and a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage as the team's primary catcher. She rounded out her Olympic playing career with a Silver medal at the 2008 Beijing Olympics.

In addition to her Olympic playing career, Nuveman Deniz was a member of Gold medal teams at the 2002 and 2006 World Championships and was part of the 1995 Junior Women's World Championship Gold medal squad. She also guided Team USA to the Gold medal at the 1999 and 2003 Pan American Games, while earning a Gold medal at the 2001 U.S. Cup.



A native of La Verne, Calif., Nuveman Deniz graduated from UCLA as the most prolific power hitter in program history. Her storied collegiate career culminated in being named as the inaugural recipient of the USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Award in 2002. She was also a four-time NFCA First-Team All-America selection who also garnered Pac-10 Player of the Year notice three times.

The catcher guided the Bruins to four NCAA Women's College World Series appearances, including the 1999 title. She ended her college career as UCLA's all-time leader in home runs (90), walks (240), total bases (653), slugging percentage (.945) and batting average (.466). She remains the program's all-time leader with 264 career games played.

In addition, Nuveman Deniz achieved several single-season marks, including belting 31 home runs in 1999 along with a .529 batting average in 2002.

Nuveman Deniz was inducted into the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012.

Courtney Martinez will serve as associate head coach for the Bandits during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season, providing experience and an eye for hitting to head coach Stacey Nuveman Deniz's staff.

Martinez completed her second season on the coaching staff at the University of Utah earlier this spring, including her first year as the Utes' associate head coach.

Utah made its debut in the Big 12 Conference during the 2025 campaign. Kennedy Proctor became the first Utah catcher to earn All-Conference honors since 2011 when she earned a spot on the All-Big 12 Second Team.

Proctor, who also claimed Big 12 All-Freshman Team distinction, was joined on the All-Big 12 Second Team by Kaylah Nelsen.

During Martinez's first season in Salt Lake City, the Utes advanced to the NCAA Tournament and won at least 35 games for the second time in the previous seven seasons. In addition, Abby Dayton (.431) and Haley Denning (.418) became just the second duo in program history to finish a season with a batting average of .400 or better.

Martinez joined the Utes' program after serving as an assistant coach at Iowa State for six seasons from 2018-23, including her final two years as an associate head coach. She guided the Cyclones to five seasons with 40 or more home runs, including 67 homers in 2021 en route to the program's first NCAA Regional appearance since 1988.

Martinez also mentored Sami Williams to NFCA First-Team All-America plaudits in 2021, becoming the first player in Iowa State history to earn the distinction. Williams used Martinez's guidance to set a pair of school records with a .446 batting average and 21 home runs, while earning a selection in the 2021 Athletes Unlimited Pro Softball College Draft.

Martinez, who worked primarily with the Cyclones' hitters and infielders, saw lowa State rise to becoming one of the most efficient defenses in the Big 12 Conference, ranking fifth in the nation with 32 double plays during the 2019 campaign. Iowa State also picked up 37 victories that season, the second-highest total in program history.

Before her time at Iowa State, Martinez was an assistant coach at UNLV for two years, including a stint as the Rebels' associate head coach during the 2017 campaign. She also spent two years as an assistant coach at Cal State Bakersfield, helping the Roadrunners transition from being an independent to playing in the Western Athletic Conference.

A native of Chino Hills, Calif., Martinez opened her coaching career with a pair of volunteer coaching opportunities with Cal State Fullerton (2009-10) and Azusa Pacific (2010-11).

Martinez, a four-year letter winner at Cal State Fullerton from 2006-09, led the Titans to four straight NCAA Regional appearances, including a Super Regional berth in 2007. The Chino Hills, Calif., product earned Second-Team Big West Conference status as a senior after leading the team in batting average (.327), on-base percentage (.402) and slugging percent-

Martinez, who finished her college career with a .260 batting average along with 20 home runs and 60 runs batted in, ranks sixth in Cal State Fullerton history by being hit by a pitch 30 times in her career, while her 43 career sacrifice hits are good for seventh on the Titans' all-time chart.

A 2009 graduate of Cal State Fullerton with a bachelor's degree in communications, Martinez also earned her master's degree in college counseling and student development from Azusa Pacific in 2013.

Grace French starred as a two-way player during her playing career at Bradley and now, she is hoping to help the Bandits shine bright during the 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season while serving as an assistant coach.

French joins the Bandits' bench after finishing her second season as a graduate assistant coach at Northwestern earlier this spring.

Under French's guidance, Northwestern secured a 30-20-1 record this past spring, including a 16-6 mark in Big Ten Conference competition, while reaching the Clemson Regional of

During French's inaugural season at Northwestern in 2024, the Wildcats compiled 35 wins and secured the Big Ten's regular season title before earning a berth in the NCAA Austin

A five-year letter winner at Bradley, French earned a pair of Second-Team All-Missouri Valley Conference citations in addition to being named to the league's All-Defensive Team twice. In the circle, the Benicia, Calif., product authored a 3.42 earned run average with 271 strikeouts over 470.1 innings while racking up 36 victories.

French was equally as successful as a hitter, authoring a .259 career batting average with 15 home runs and 80 runs batted in. She stands sixth in Bradley program history with 33 career doubles, while her 24 times being hit by a pitch rank third on the all-time chart.

Named to the NFCA All-Mideast Region Second Team in 2022, French posted a career-best .288 batting average with seven home runs and 32 runs batted in, while scoring 34 runs and posting an .894 OPS.

An outstanding student who earned 14 academic awards during her collegiate career, French owns a bachelor's degree in kinesiology and health sciences from Bradley in addition to a master's degree in business administration.

Mike Lotief brings a wealth of experience into the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season, joining the Bandits' staff as an assistant coach.

Lotief previously served as the head softball coach at Louisiana from 2003-17, including the first 10 seasons as co-head coach with his wife, Stefni Lotief. He led the Ragin' Cajuns to the NCAA Tournament in every season while compiling an impressive 731-178-1 (.804) record.

Under Lotief's guidance, Louisiana claimed 13 Sun Belt Conference regular season titles and advanced to the Women's College World Series three times.

In his final season at Louisiana, Lotief's squad led the nation in scoring and sported a Sun Belt record 23-1 mark in league play. The Ragin' Cajuns also ranked in the top 10 nationally in home runs, slugging percentage, on-base percentage and batting average.

The program advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals in five straight seasons from 2012-16, while finishing inside the top 15 in national polls during each of those campaigns. The 2014 squad earned a berth in the NCAA Women's College World Series, which started a four-year run of Lotief claiming Sun Belt Coach of the Year laurels from 2014-17.

Lotief guided Louisiana to 40 or more wins during all 15 seasons as its head coach, including eight 50-win campaigns and a program-record 60 victories in 2004.

Renowned for his power hitting philosophy, Lotief saw his teams belt 100 or more home runs in a season three times, including 116 homers in 2015 and 108 long balls in 2016. He also mentored Lexie Elkins, who went from not hitting a home run during her freshman year to finishing her career with 75 career homers while registering a school-record .430 batting average over three seasons.


Elkins, who stands as one of three players in Louisiana history to earn NFCA All-America plaudits three times, was a three-time selection as Sun Belt Player of the Year in addition to being named NFCA Division I Catcher of the Year in back-to-back seasons. She was the No. 1 overall selection in the 2016 National Pro Fastpitch College Draft by the Pennsylvania

In total, Lotief's guidance led to 1,127 home runs, 4,915 runs and a .307 batting average. He joined the Louisiana coaching staff as a volunteer assistant in 2001-02 before ascending to the co-head coaching role for the next 15 seasons.

Before beginning his softball coaching career, Lotief opened his own law practice in 1992. He also coached the Louisiana Reflections, a summer program he helped establish, to five consecutive state titles and five national tournament appearances, including the AFA 18U National Championship in 2000. Lotief's coaching led to over 20 of his players receiving scholarships to play at the NCAA Division I level.

A 2016 ASA/USA Louisiana Softball Hall of Fame inductee, Lotief received the 2016 Donna Newberry "Perseverance" Award from the NFCA.

Lotief received his bachelor's degree from Louisiana in 1985 before earning his juris doctorate from LSU in 1988.



Dana Sorensen leads the Blaze into the inaugural 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season as its general manager.

Sorensen joins the Blaze front office after running her own softball coaching organization, Sorensen Elite, following an outstanding playing career. She has worked with pitchers across all levels of softball, including the professional, college and high school ranks.

A starting pitcher for Stanford from 2000-04, Sorensen accumulated three NFCA All-America certificates, including First-Team distinction as a sophomore and senior. The four-time NFCA All-Pacific Region performer left her mark on the Cardinal program, graduating with nearly every single-season pitching mark in school history. She compiled a 105-36 career record with a program-record 1.05 career ERA.

In addition to being one of three players in Stanford history with 100 or more victories, Sorensen holds the distinction of being one of two pitchers to post 1,000 or more strikeouts after notching 1,154 strikeouts for the Cardinal. She also accrued five career no-hitters, including a pair of perfect games.

The Cardinal reached the NCAA Tournament during each of Sorensen's four seasons, including a pair of entries into the Women's College World Series in 2001 and 2004. She was inducted into the Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame in 2015, earning the honor of being one of just four softball players to be enshrined.

After her college career, Sorensen played two seasons in the National Pro Fastpitch (NPF) league, spending the 2005 season with the Arizona Heat following one season with the New England Riptide. She was a member of the USA Softball Elite Team in 2005 and attended the USA Softball National Team Camp five times.

Sorensen began her coaching career with a three-year stint as an assistant coach at UC Davis before spending a pair of seasons at Oregon State as the team's pitching coach.

A 2004 Stanford graduate, Sorensen holds a bachelor's degree in sociology and communications and received her master's degree in exercise and sport science from North Carolina in 2006.

Brown, who also secured Third-Team NFCA All-Midwest Region accolades, also joined infielder Ruby Tarr on the OVC's All-Freshman Team this past spring.

Prior to joining the Leathernecks, Goler spent time as an assistant coach at Penn State. The Nittany Lions showed substantial improvement in Goler's two seasons, going from nine wins in 2018 to 24 victories in 2019. The 2019 squad also established a new program record by slugging 49 home runs.

Goler joined the Penn State staff after serving as an assistant coach at Syracuse from 2016-18. She served as the program's recruiting coordinator and hitting coach before later being elevated to the Orange's associate head coach. The 2017 campaign saw four players earn NFCA All-Region plaudits after the team set single-season records for batting average (.307), hits (433) and on-base percentage (.388).

Goler's initial college coaching assignment came at Roosevelt University in 2014 where she was the Lakers' hitting coach.

In addition to her college coaching experience, Goler made her international coaching debut as an assistant coach for USA Softball's Elite and U-18 teams in 2024. She will work as an assistant coach with Team USA's squad this year at the WBSC U-15 World Cup along with coaching the United States unit at the WBSC U-18 World Cup.

After a standout collegiate playing career at Georgia, Goler played seven seasons in National Pro Fastpitch (NPF). The No. 12 overall selection in the 2011 NPF Draft by the Chicago Bandits, she went on to earn the league's 2011 Rookie of the Year award after pacing the squad with a .327 batting average, 11 home runs, 29 runs batted in and 20 walks. She also collected a pair of All-NPF certificates in her career.

Goler was lauded as a three-time NFCA All-America selection at Georgia while rewriting the program record book from 2008-11. The infielder piloted the Bulldogs 40 or more wins in each of her four seasons, including a 51-14 record as a junior, while leading Georgia to the NCAA Women's College World Series in 2010 and 2011.

The three-time First-Team All-SEC performer also earned a spot on the league's All-Defensive Team at third base during her senior season. In addition, she appeared on USA Softball's National Collegiate Player of the Year Top 25 list in 2011.

Goler compiled a .455 batting average during her sophomore season at Georgia, a mark that still tops the Bulldogs' all-time single-season chart. She closed her career as the program's all-time leader with 58 career home runs, becoming the first player in school history to surpass 50 career homers.

Goler, who ranks among the Bulldogs' all-time leaders with 52 career doubles, still stands as the program's career leader with 184 career walks. She also owns the top single-season mark after drawing 64 free passes during her senior season.

A 2010 graduate of Georgia, Goler holds a bachelor's and master's degree in recreation and leisure studies.

Kara Dill embarks on her professional softball coaching career during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season by filling the role of associate head coach on Alisa Goler's staff.

The 10th head coach in UT Arlington softball history, Dill completed her third season as the Mavericks' bench boss earlier this spring. Under her guidance, UT Arlington's win total has increased each year, including a 23-win campaign in 2025. The Mavericks have also qualified for the Western Athletic Conference Tournament in each of Dill's three years at the helm.

Dill led the Mavericks to the WAC Tournament quarterfinals in 2024 while mentoring Camille Corona, who earned NFCA All-Region status in addition to First-Team All-WAC plaudits after pacing the Mavericks with a .401 batting average and 31 runs scored.

In Dill's inaugural season with UT Arlington, the Mavericks fashioned a 22-30 record, including an 11-13 mark in WAC play. Freshman Marley Neises earned a spot on the All-WAC Second Team after logging a .382 batting average.

Prior to leading the Mavericks, Dill served as the pitching coach at Texas A&M for six seasons. She helped the Aggies secure their 20th consecutive NCAA Regional appearance during her final season as the Texas A&M staff combined for 13 shutouts in 2022.

During the 2021 campaign, the Aggies' pitching staff registered a pair of no-hitters for the first time in nearly a decade.

Texas A&M's pitching staff showed immediate improvement during Dill's first season, lowering its combined earned run average from 3.86 to 2.08, as the Aggies earned a berth in the 2017 NCAA Women's College World Series.

Before arriving in College Station, Dill worked as an assistant coach for the National Pro Fastpitch's Scrap Yard Dawgs in 2016. The LaGrange, Ohio, native also guided LSU to a pair of NCAA Women's College World Series berths in 2015 and 2016 after opening her coaching career with a Women's College World Series appearance with Kentucky in 2014.

A four-year letter winner at Kentucky from 2010-13, Dill compiled a .330 batting average with 201 total base hits and 57 stolen bases, which are tied for eighth in program history. The two-time Second-Team All-Southeastern Conference performer also claimed a spot on the NFCA All-Region Second Team in 2011 after batting .377 with 44 runs scored.

An outstanding student at Kentucky who graduated with her bachelor's degree three semesters early, Dill also earned her master's degree at Kentucky and was named to the Frank G. Ham Society of Character, which honors Kentucky student-athletes who have shown an extraordinary commitment to academic excellence, athletic participation, personal development and career preparation while serving as a role model. In addition, she was a nominee for the NCAA's Senior CLASS Award.



ASSISTANT COACH

Winning has been a major part of Sue Kunkle's career as the head softball coach at the University of Southern Indiana. She hopes to continue her winning tradition during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League season as she serves as an assistant coach for the Blaze.

Kunkle, the winningest coach in USI softball history, completed her 24th season with the Screaming Eagles in 2025. The three-time Coach of the Year honoree has fashioned a 707-513 record during her tenure while transitioning the Screaming Eagles from NCAA Division II to NCAA Division I status.

Under Kunkle's leadership, Southern Indiana softball student-athletes have accounted for 18 NFCA All-America selections, 61 NFCA All-Region certificates, five conference Player of the Year awards and 90 All-Conference citations.

During the 2025 campaign, the Screaming Eagles collected 13 wins against Ohio Valley Conference competition and earned a berth in the league's postseason tournament for the third year in a row. Three student-athletes earned Second-Team All-OVC distinction, including junior Caroline Stapleton and freshmen Kylie Witthaus and Jordan Mackey.

Playing in just its second NCAA Division I season, Southern Indiana logged 25 victories during the 2024 campaign while advancing to the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament semifinals. Josie Newman garnered OVC Pitcher of the Year plaudits while anchoring a group of four All-OVC honorees.

The Screaming Eagles made their Division I debut in 2023 and posted a 21-23 record, including a victory over Wisconsin-Green Bay in their season opener along with a win over Tennessee State in the OVC Tournament. Utility player Allie Goodin was selected as a co-recipient of the OVC Player of the Year award while Newman was a three-time OVC Pitcher of the Week winner. Over her 22 seasons at the helm of the Screaming Eagles at the Division II level, Kunkle posted a 628-420-1 (.599) record, including 301 victories in Great Lakes Valley Conference play. She guided the team to the 2018 NCAA Division II title in addition to a pair of GLVC Tournament titles and two regular season crowns.

Kunkle's teams surpassed the 30-win plateau 12 times across 22 seasons of Division II play, including three campaigns with 40 or more victories. The Screaming Eagles established a program record with 49 victories and won the program's first NCAA Midwest Region crown in 2022, marking a 33-win improvement from the previous season.

In addition, Kunkle's staff was recognized as the NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year three times and claimed the NFCA National Division II Coaching Staff of the Year award after guiding the Screaming Eagles to the first national championship by any women's team in school history in 2018.

Along with her experience at USI, Kunkle has coached a pair of USA Athletes International teams, including a first place finish in Holland in 2005 and a third place effort in Australia during the 2006 event.

Kunkle took over the USI softball program after serving as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Akron. She started her coaching career at her alma mater, California University of Pennsylvania, as a volunteer assistant coach before spending a year at Morehead State University.

A 1994 graduate of California University of Pennsylvania with a bachelor's degree in education, Kunkle graduated as the program's all-time winningest pitcher with a 54-12 record. She piloted the Vulcans to three consecutive Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference West titles and earned the league's overall crown in 1991.

After earning All-Region distinction during her junior season, Kunkle guided the Vulcans to their first-ever NCAA Division II Women's College World Series berth during her final year. In addition to her bachelor's degree, Kunkle owns a master's degree in sports science and coaching from Akron.

Ryan Wondrasek joins the Blaze coaching staff in an assistant coach role for the inaugural 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season.

Wondrasek completed his third season as the Director of Player Development on Patty Gasso's staff at Oklahoma earlier this year. In his role with the Sooners, Wondrasek oversees data, analytics and video to scout upcoming opponents while aiding with recruiting and development of the team's catchers.

During Wondrasek's three seasons in Norman, the Sooners have compiled an impressive 172-17 (.910) record with three NCAA Women's College World Series appearances, including a pair of national championships. Oklahoma has won 50 or more games each year, including 61 victories during the 2023 campaign.

Before joining the Sooners' staff, Wondrasek spent the 2022 season as the head softball coach at Northwestern Oklahoma State. He piloted the team to its most victories since 2017 and mentored a pair of All-Great American Conference performers.

Wondrasek spent three seasons as the head softball at Seward County Community College, earning the conference's Coach of the Year award in his first season while guiding 10 players to All-Conference recognition.

An assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Omaha from 2016-18, Wondrasek oversaw the program's offense as well as instructing the infielders and coaches. Under his leadership, seven players earned All-Summit League distinction.

Wondrasek embarked on his softball coaching career at St. Gregory's University from 2012-16, working as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. The Cavaliers compiled a 172-47 record, including an 81-25 mark in the Sooner Athletic Conference, while making a pair of appearances at the NAIA Softball World Series.

Wondrasek began his coaching career as a varsity assistant coach for the Norman High School baseball program from 2007-12. He oversaw instruction for the team's catchers, infielders and base running. A pair of catchers claimed Oklahoma All-State plaudits under his tutelage.

After graduating from Oklahoma in 2012 with a bachelor's degree, Wondrasek received his master's degree in secondary education and sports administration from East Central University in 2016.

A legend in the sport of softball, Lisa Fernandez begins her tenure as general manager for the Talons during the inaugural 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season.

Fernandez is in her 27th season on the coaching staff at UCLA, which is also her alma mater. She is also in her third year as the Mark Kalmansohn Associate Head Coach where her primary focus is working with the team's hitters and infielders while managing the program's recruiting department.

With Fernandez on the Bruins' bench, the team has compiled a 1,266-270-2 record with five NCAA titles and 13 Women's College World Series appearances. UCLA has also claimed seven regular season conference championships and also owns one league tournament title.

Fernandez has been honored as a member of the NFCA National Coaching Staff of the Year three times (2004, 2010, 2019) and NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year eight times (2000, 2010, 2014-16, 2019, 2021, 2024) during her time at UCLA.

Before assuming the associate head coaching role with the Bruins, Fernandez led a pitching staff that has collected 21 total NFCA All-America selections and ranked in the top 10 nationally in earned run average during each of Fernandez's last five seasons in the role. She saw AUSL star Rachel Garcia garner a pair of Honda Cups, including three Honda Sport Awards for softball, and a pair of USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year accolades. Fernandez also guided fellow AUSL hurler Megan Faraimo as the program's first back-to-back Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year.

A three-time Olympian, Fernandez was the only player to appear in the 1996, 2000 and 2004 Gold medal games for Team USA, pitching in all three contests. In the 2004 Athens Olympics, Fernandez established an Olympic record with a .545 batting average while leading the team to its third straight Gold medal.

Fernandez set another Olympic record with 25 strikeouts in a single game and ended the 2000 Sydney Olympics with an 0.47 ERA as Team USA claimed its second straight Gold medal. In her first Olympiad, Fernandez posted a 1-1 record and an 0.33 ERA as the USA won a Gold medal in front of a home crowd at the 1996 Atlanta Olympics.

Fernandez fashioned a 7-1 record in the circle during 11 career Olympic appearances with one save across 74.2 innings of work. She held a 0.37 earned run average and struck out 93 batters while surrendering just seven walks.

As a hitter, Fernandez also excelled at the plate, posting a .302 batting average (23-for-76) with three home runs, 15 runs batted in and 10 runs scored. She was also an alternate for the 2008 Beijing Olympics.

In addition to her Olympic accolades, Fernandez propelled Team USA to Gold medals at four straight World Championships between 1990 and 2002. She also claimed a trio of Gold medals at the 1991, 1999 and 2003 Pan American Games.

Lauded as one of the greatest players in the sport's history, Fernandez was a standout for UCLA from 1990-93 where she was a four-time Honda Sports Award winner as the nation's best player. She was also the first softball athlete to claim the Honda Broderick Cup in 1993 as the country's most outstanding collegiate female student-athlete.

A four-time First-Team All-America recipient, the pitcher/infielder led the Bruins to a 222-21 record and the 1990 and 1992 NCAA titles. The team also finished as the national runner-up in 1991 and 1993

Fernandez, a two-way star for the Bruins, finished her collegiate career with a 93-7 record in the circle with one save over 107 appearances. She authored a 0.22 career earned run average with 95 complete games and 784 strikeouts over 694.2 innings.

As a hitter, Fernandez authored a .381 career batting average (287-for-752) and 128 runs batted in across 240 career games. She scored 142 runs and drew 85 walks compared to just 16 strikeouts.

Fernandez led the nation as a senior with a .510 batting average and a 0.25 ERA on her way to the 1993 Honda-Broderick Cup. She was the recipient of the NCAA Top Six Award in 1994 as one of the top six senior student-athletes across all divisions.

In her junior season, Fernandez tallied a miniscule 0.14 ERA and posted one of just three undefeated pitching seasons in NCAA softball history after finishing with a 29-0 record.

Fernandez was inducted into the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003 before earning enshrinement as a 2013 inductee in the USA Softball Hall of Fame. In addition, Fernandez is a two-time selection to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame, earning the honor as an individual and as a member of the 2004 Olympic Softball Team.



An experienced coach with an eye for hitting, Howard Dobson will serve as the head coach of the Talons during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season.

Dobson spent 13 seasons as an assistant softball coach at LSU from 2012-24, helping the Tigers earn 12 NCAA Tournament entries, including four Women's College World Series appearances.

While working with the Tigers' hitters, Dobson tutored 13 All-America honorees, 12 First-Team All-Southeastern Conference selections and 14 Second-Team All-SEC picks. He also helped produce over a dozen record-breaking seasons by hitters and maintained LSU as one of the top programs in the sport.

In Dobson's last season with LSU in 2024, the Tigers compiled a 44-17 record and advanced to the NCAA Super Regional for the 10th time in program history, including the first time since 2021. The Tigers ranked third in the SEC with a .290 team batting average and placed five players on the NFCA All-Region teams in addition to three All-SEC selections.

Under Dobson's guidance, LSU advanced to the Women's College World Series in three consecutive seasons from 2015-17. The Tigers posted back-to-back 50-win campaigns in 2015 and 2016 before achieving a 48-22 mark in 2017.

Dobson arrived in Baton Rouge after a stint as the head coach at Southern Miss from 2008-11. He led the Golden Eagles to 93 wins over four seasons and saw Southern Miss earn seven All-Conference certificates. Megan Hill, who finished her career holding eight school records, also became the first Southern Miss player to earn NFCA All-Midwest Region plaudits since 2000.

Dobson was involved with USA Softball between 2012-21, including the 2020 WBSC World Championship where Team USA won the Gold medal on a 7-6 walk-off victory. The win secured a spot in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics where Dobson helped Team USA claim the Silver medal. In addition, Dobson coached teams at the World Cup of Softball, Canadian Open, Pan American Games in addition to repeating as champions at the 2016 World Championship.

A native of Orange, Texas, Dobson spent five seasons as an assistant softball at Oklahoma, where he guided seven players to All-America status and 15 NFCA All-Midwest Region selections. The Sooners reached the Women's College World Series with Dobson on the bench in 2003 and 2004 while earning a berth in the NCAA Super Regional during each of his five years with the team.

Prior to his time in Norman, Dobson helped begin the softball program at Houston after a two-year stint at Southeastern Louisiana. Dobson, who spent two years on the Cougars' staff, holds the honor of being the first assistant coach in program history.

Dobson began his extensive coaching career as a volunteer assistant at McNeese State before coaching at various locations, including Pelican State, Barbe High School and La-Grange High School.

A collegiate baseball player, Dobson played at Panola College (NJCAA) for two years and earned All-Conference honors before ending his career at McNeese State for the 1994-95 seasons. While with the Cowboys, Dobson held a .306 batting average across 46 games.

Dobson earned a bachelor's degree in health and human performance and English from McNeese State in 1997.





Kirk Walker has played an integral part in the success of the UCLA softball program for over two decades and now, he is hoping to guide the Talons to similar success during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League season in 2025.

Walker transitioned into working as the Bruins' director of softball administration this spring after serving as an assistant coach and associate head coach. In Walker's coaching stints with UCLA, the Bruins won seven NCAA titles and reached the Women's College World Series 18 times across 23 seasons.

With Walker in the dugout, the Bruins compiled an impressive 828-156-1 (.840) record with 11 conference regular season titles and a Pac-12 Conference Tournament championship. UCLA also earned the NCAA title in 1984, 1985, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992 and 2019.

Serving as the Bruins' third base coach, Walker was a member of the 2019 NFCA National Coaching Staff of the Year in addition to earning six NFCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year certificates. UCLA players accumulated 61 NFCA All-America citations, 127 All-Conference selections and 11 CoSIDA/College Sports Communicators Academic All-America® awards.

Walker began his coaching career as an undergraduate assistant at UCLA in 1984 and was a member of the Bruins' staff for 11 years before taking the head coaching position at Oregon State. He worked closely with the UCLA pitchers and was instrumental in the development and success of numerous players, including Debbie Doom, Tracy Compton and Lisa Fernandez.

The all-time winningest coach in Oregon State history with a 594-490-3 (.548) record, Walker spent 18 seasons with the Beavers and led them to 10 postseason appearances and 40 or more wins in a season eight times.

In 2006, Walker piloted the Beavers to the first Women's College World Series appearance in program history with a No. 5 national ranking and a 43-16 mark, which included a school-record 28-game winning streak. Oregon State authored an identical 43-16 record and won its first Pac-10 Conference title in 2005, earning Walker the league's Coach of the Year honor.

Oregon State's most successful season came in 1999 when the Beavers won a school-record 47 games and reached the postseason for the first time in school history. Walker's staff was recognized as a co-recipient of the Speedline Pacific Region Coaching Staff of the Year award, while Walker was named the Pac-10's Coach of the Year.

Under Walker's guidance, Oregon State student-athletes accounted for 33 All-Conference citations, 10 NFCA All-America awards and 26 NFCA All-Region honors.

Walker returned to the UCLA dugout in advance of the 2013 season, serving as an assistant coach from 2013-22 before elevating to the role of associate head coach ahead of the 2023 season

In addition to his success at the collegiate level, Walker was instrumental in the organization and coaching of the Finland Softball Women's National Team in 2022. The squad secured its first international victory against Turkey at the WBSC European Championships.

Walker also owns coaching experience at the professional level. He served as head coach for the PFX Pro Tour for four seasons in addition to being head coach and general manager for the California Commotion of the National Pro Fastpitch.

In 2017, Walker was an assistant coach on the USA Softball Junior Women's National Team that won the Gold medal at the WBSC Junior Women's World Championship. He was also one of 12 coaches to form the Team USA Women's National Team Coaches Pool for the 2004 Athens Olympics and spent time as an assistant coach for the USA Elite Team from 2002-04.

One of the most visible and vocal advocates for diversity and inclusion in sports, Walker is one of the founders of the Equality Coaching Alliance and the LGBTIQ+ Sports Coalition while serving as a founding board member for the Sports Equality Foundation. He is also the coordinator of the NFCA's LGBTQ+ Convention session.

In October 2024, Walker was named as one of the top 100 most powerful and influential LGBTQ people in sports by Outsports. He will be inducted into the LGBTQ Sports Hall of Fame on August 10, 2025, in Las Vegas.

Walker's impact in softball extends beyond the coaching level. He is a co-founder and owner of the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic, college softball's premier early-season tournament that has brought thousands of fans to the Palm Springs area for over 20 years.



In addition to his coaching success, Walker boasts a playing resume that includes being named Most Valuable Pitcher after winning the 2015 North America Fastpitch Association Men's Masters 40-and-Over National Championship. He won a second title in 2019 and has been an All-World Team selection six times.

Walker earned his bachelor's degree in kinesiology from UCLA in 1988.



Jo Koons starts her first season in the professional ranks by serving as an assistant coach for the Talons during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) campaign.

The Chico, Calif., native continues a busy year of coaching after completing her first season as the head softball coach at Abilene Christian. The fifth head coach in Wildcats' history, she piloted ACU to its first berth in the Western Athletic Conference Tournament since 2022 after earning the No. 5 seed with an 11-13 record in league play.

Koons, who was named as the Wildcats' bench boss on June 27, 2024, also mentored senior pitcher Lina Russo, who earned Second-Team All-WAC status after leading the league in innings pitched (178.1) while ranking third in the circuit with 105 strikeouts.

Prior to joining Abilene Christian, Koons spent two seasons as an assistant coach at UT Arlington. She worked primarily with the Mavericks' defense and served as the program's recruiting coordinator.

In 2024, Koons coached UT Arlington to a 23-34 record, including an 11-14 mark in the Western Athletic Conference. The Mavericks, who placed sixth in the WAC standings, reached the league's semifinals after downing Tarleton and Seattle University in the postseason event.

Koons also mentored First-Team All-WAC honoree Camille Corona, who was also a member of the league's All-Defensive Team.

During Koons' first season at UT Arlington, the Mavericks authored a 22-30 record and finished seventh in the WAC regular season standings with a 11-13 mark. Marley Neises garnered Second-Team All-WAC status after leading the Mavericks with a .382 batting average and seven home runs.

Koons worked as an assistant coach at Longwood University during the 2022 campaign, leading the Lancers to a berth in the Big South Conference championship game. Anchored by Big South Freshman of the Year Jaden Pone, Longwood posted a 34-24 overall record with a 21-6 league mark in Koons' lone season with the Lancers.

Koons also spent two seasons on the coaching staff at Oregon, overseeing one of the top defensive units in the nation. The Ducks claimed 40 wins during the 2021 campaign and ranked 15th nationally with a .977 fielding percentage.

Koons' coaching resume also includes stops at Utah State, Colorado Christian and Stanford. She served as the head coach at Lassen College in California during the 2018 season.

A four-year letter winner at shortstop for Utah State from 2012-15, Koons compiled a .271 career batting average while appearing in 203 games. She closed her career with 156 hits, including 20 doubles and 10 triples, while scoring 92 runs.

Koons graduated from Utah State in 2015 with a bachelor's degree in interdisciplinary studies before earning her master's degree in organizational leadership from Colorado Christian in 2018.





Alex Ibarra's familiarity with Athletes Unlimited will come in handy for the Talons' coaching staff during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season in 2025.

Ibarra, who will be part of Howard Dobson's staff during the opening week of the season, spent time as a batting practice pitcher for AU Pro Softball during the 2022 Championship Season and 2023 AUX season.

Ibarra completed his first season as an assistant coach at Appalachian State this spring, leading the Mountaineers to a 23-27 record. Three members of the Mountaineers' roster earned All-Sun Belt Conference distinction, including Makayla McClain, who was a First-Team All-Sun Belt selection in addition to earning a spot on the NFCA All-Mid-Atlantic Region Second Team.

Prior to joining the Appalachian State staff, the Cedar Hill, Texas, native was a graduate student manager for the LSU softball team, assisting with day-to-day operations for the program in addition to throwing batting practice. During his time in Baton Rouge, the Tigers secured 155 wins and reached the NCAA Tournament four times.

Ibarra started his college career as a manager at UT Arlington in 2019. The Mavericks won 36 games during his lone season and won the National Invitational Softball Championship.

Ibarra was named to the first-ever USA Softball U-23 Men's National Team as a pitcher. He also earned a spot on the 2018 USA Softball Junior Men's National Team and competed in the WBSC World Championship in Prince Albert, Canada.

Ibarra was also on the coaching staff for the USA Women's National Team in October 2022 and helped the squad earn a berth in the 2023 Pan American Games.

Ibarra earned his bachelor's degree in sports administration from LSU in 2023 and is currently working toward his master's degree in sports administration.





Will Oldham embarks on his coaching journey at the professional level by joining the Talons' staff as an assistant coach during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League season.

Oldham completed his third season as a member of the coaching staff at UCLA this spring after serving as the director of player development and data analytics. He opened his time at UCLA in 2023 as a volunteer assistant coach before moving into his current role.

In 2024, the Bruins overcame a 3-4 start to post a 43-12 record and earn a berth into the NCAA Women's College World Series. The turnaround vaulted Oldham and the Bruins' coaching staff into being honored as the NFCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

Oldham worked closely with infielder Maya Brady and catcher Sharlize Palacios, helping the duo garner NFCA All-America status. Brady earned her second straight Pac-12 Conference Player of the Year citation after leading UCLA with a .418 batting average and 68 runs batted in, while Palacios belted five of her 20 home runs in the NCAA Tournament.

The Bruins also won the Pac-12 regular season and tournament titles as Palacios was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. They also fashioned a perfect 5-0 record in NCAA Regional and Super Regional action to secure the program's eighth WCWS berth in the last nine tournaments.

In Oldham's first year at UCLA, the Bruins posted a 52-7 record and secured the Pac-12 regular season title with three players earning NFCA All-America notice. Brady was a Top-3 finalist for the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award after setting career highs for batting average (.448), home runs (18) and slugging percentage (.866).

Megan Grant and Jordan Woolery, meanwhile, were Top 10 finalists for the NFCA Freshman of the Year award after combining to drive in 104 runs, the most by a rookie duo in program history.

Oldham, who also has seven years of high school softball coaching experience in the Palm Springs area, was born in Indio, Calif.

A name synonymous with softball in the United States, Cat Osterman returns to Athletes Unlimited as the general manager for the Volts during the inaugural 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) season.

Renowned as one of the top pitchers in the sport's history, Osterman competed in three Olympic Games while serving as a member of the United States National Team from 2001-10 and 2019-21. She guided Team USA to the Gold medal in the 2004 Athens Olympics with two victories and a save while serving as the youngest player on the roster.

Team USA also claimed a Silver medal in the 2008 Beijing Olympics and the 2020 Tokyo Olympics with Osterman anchoring the pitching staff. Over her 20 seasons playing at softball's highest level, Osterman fashioned an impressive 74-5 record in the circle with a 0.44 earned run average and 1,030 strikeouts over 519.0 innings.

The only three-time winner of the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award, Osterman had a historic playing career at Texas from 2002-06. She led the Longhorns to three Women's College World Series appearances in 2003, 2005 and 2006 and earned a pair of WCWS All-Tournament Team certificates. The four-time NFCA All-America performer claimed the sport's highest honor as the 2005 and 2006 Honda Award winner for softball and was honored as the 2005 and 2006 ESPY Award winner as the Top Collegiate Female Athlete.

Osterman still holds several Longhorns' career pitching records, including wins (136), earned run average (0.51), shutouts (85), no-hitters (20), perfect games (7), innings pitched (1,105.2), appearances (180) and strikeouts (2,265). She also holds the distinction of being the only student-athlete in softball history to lead the nation in earned run average multiple times, doing so three times.

With a 14.34 strikeout-per-seven-inning average, Osterman still holds the NCAA top mark after nearly 20 years. She limited opposing hitters to just a .096 clip across her collegiate career

A four-time Big 12 Conference Pitcher of the Year honoree, Osterman still owns league records in career wins, ERA, strikeouts, no-hitters, perfect games and shutouts. She also claimed the 2006 NCAA Today's Top VIII Award, which was awarded to the top eight senior student-athletes in the country. She is one of just five pitchers in NCAA Division I history to record at least 100 career victories, 1,000 career strikeouts and a career ERA under 1.00.

In addition to her success in the circle, Osterman also excelled academically at Texas and garnered Third-Team CoSIDA Academic All-America® honors as a sophomore in addition to three Academic All-Big 12 Conference Team citations. She will be inducted into the College Sports Communicators Academic All-America® Hall of Fame in June 2025.

After graduating from Texas, Osterman was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2006 National Pro Fastpitch (NPF) league draft by the Connecticut Brakettes, but never played with the team. She spent two seasons with the Rockford Thunder, earning MVP honors at the NPF Championship Series after leading Rockford to the league title over the USSSA Pride.

Osterman went on to lead the USSSA Pride to three NPF championships over six seasons. She earned All-NPF status six times, including a pair of Pitcher of the Year certificates, and finished as the league's all-time leader with a 0.91 career earned run average. In addition, Osterman ranks second in league history with 1,260 strikeouts.

In addition to her playing career, Osterman spent six years as an assistant coach at Texas State, helping the Bobcats rise to the top of the Sun Belt Conference. Texas State, which reached the NCAA Tournament three times during Osterman's tenure, closed the 2018 season with a 43-16 record and the regular season and tournament titles, marking the program's first championships since joining the league.

With Osterman in the dugout, the Bobcats' pitching staff posted a sub-2.00 earned run average three times over six seasons.

Before joining the Texas State staff, Osterman spent three seasons as an assistant coach at St. Edwards University. The Hilltoppers compiled a 98-69 record and an appearance in the NCAA DIvision II Super Regionals. St. Edwards won the Heartland Conference Tournament in 2012, while climbing to a runner-up finish in the league postseason in 2013 and 2014.

Osterman began her coaching career at DePaul from 2008-10, helping the Blue Demons earn three Big East Championships and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances.

No stranger to Athletes Unlimited Pro Softball, Osterman earned the inaugural 2020 AU Pro Softball Championship Season title with a league-record 2,408 leaderboard points. She garnered 14 wins in 23 career appearances and still holds league standards for earned run average (1.64) and innings (124.0), while her 145 strikeouts are second on the all-time chart.



Osterman was 16-8 as a captain over two seasons, including a league-record 10 wins during the inaugural campaign.

Osterman was enshrined in the Texas Sports Hall of Fame in 2013 before securing a spot in the World of Little League® Hall of Excellence. She was the fourth female and first softball inductee to join the Hall of Excellence.

Osterman earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from Texas in 2007 before securing a master's degree in educational and counseling psychology with a concentration in positive coaching from Missouri in 2015.

Osterman, who is married to Joey Ashley, has a daughter named Jaycee and a step-daughter named Bracken.

A prolific player at all levels of the game, Kelly Kretschman begins her first season in the Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) as the head coach of the Volts in 2025.

Kretschman was the head coach for the 2024 U.S. Women's Elite Team, while serving as an assistant for the U-18 Women's National Team in the same year. She began her coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Maryland in 2012 before moving on to be an assistant at Texas State for the 2015 and 2016 seasons.

Kretschman was the head coach for the USSSA Pride for the 2022 and 2023 Women's Professional Fastpitch campaigns after a successful playing career with the team. The Pride finished the inaugural WPF season with an 18-16 record and was the league runner-up.

A two-time Olympian, Kretschman joined the United States National Team in 2000 before serving as an alternate for the Sydney Olympics. She guided Team USA to a Gold medal at the 2004 Athens Olympics after batting .333 with one home run and five runs batted in.

In addition, Kretschman competed at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, leading Team USA to a Silver medal. She compiled a .348 batting average with one home run, five runs scored and six runs batted in.

Kretschman played for Team USA during the 2018 Japan All-Star Series and Japan Cup, while hitting an impressive .625 at the 2018 USA Softball International Cup. Her international career also included Gold medals at the 2007 Pan American Games and World Cup of Softball.

A native of Indiana Harbour Beach, Florida, Kretschman batted at a .429 clip in leading Team USA to a Silver medal at the 2005 World Cup of Softball. She also batted .355 with six runs batted in while leading the U.S. Women's Elite Team to a Gold medal at the 2003 Canada Cup.

Kretschman spent 13 seasons in the National Pro Fastpitch (NPF) league, including 11 years with the USSSA Pride (2009-19). She garnered three consecutive NPF Player of the Year awards from 2015-17 and claimed All-NPF status nine times.

In 2006, she became the first player in NPF history to earn the league's 'Triple Crown' after pacing the circuit with a .466 batting average, 13 home runs and 45 runs batted in. She was also honored as the league's Offensive Player of the Year for her efforts in leading the USSSA Pride to the regular season crown.

Kretschman's teams claimed the Cowles Cup Championship seven times in her 13-year NPF career, including five titles with the USSSA Pride. In addition to collecting a league-record 512 career hits, she stands as the league's all-time leader with 87 doubles, 324 walks and 265 runs batted in, while her 55 career home runs are second on the all-time chart. She went on to play three seasons in the Japan Diamond Softball League, spending two years with Denso Bright Pegasus before competing with Toda Medics in 2020.

The first player in Alabama softball history to earn NFCA All-America honors, Kretschman guided the Crimson Tide to a 204-69 (.747) record and three NCAA Tournament appearances during her college career from 1998-2001. Led by Kretschman, Alabama reached the NCAA Women's College World Series for the first time in program history in 2000 after putting together a 66-win season.

After garnering Second-Team All-America distinction in each of her first two seasons at Alabama, Kretschman rose to First-Team All-America status for her junior and senior seasons while becoming the first player in program history with four All-America certificates. In addition, she was a three-time First-Team All-Southeastern Conference pick after earning Second-Team notice as a freshman in 1998.

Kretschman finished her college career as the Crimson Tide's all-time leader with a .437 batting average. She also graduated as the program's record holder in career games started (273), at-bats (842), runs scored (288), hits (368), doubles (65), triples (16), home runs (60), runs batted in (191), walks (161) and stolen bases (133).

Entering the 2025 season, Kretschman still holds nine Alabama career records, including slugging percentage (.766), games started, runs scored, hits, doubles, triples, total bases and intentional walks (29).

Kretschman also owns numerous single-game standards in the Alabama record book. She is the only player in program history with 100 or more hits in a season, tallying 102 hits during her junior season after recording 100 hits as a freshman. She also registered a school-record 22 doubles in 1998 while becoming the first player in program history with 25 home runs in a single campaign.

Her 211 total bases during the 1998 season also rank as the top total in program history.

Courtney Gettins begins her first season as a member of the Volts' coaching staff during the 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) campaign, serving as the team's associate head coach.

Gettins, a 2019 graduate of Alabama, completed her fourth season as an assistant softball coach at Mercer University this spring. The Bears have collected 97 victories during Gettins' time at Mercer, including 38 wins in 2025, which mark the second-highest total in program history.

Led by pitcher Grace Taylor, the Bears captured the program's first Southern Conference Tournament title this spring after winning seven games across a four-day span. Taylor was crowned as the tournament's Most Outstanding Player after fashioning a 4-0 record with a 0.76 earned run average over 18.1 innings.

In addition, Mercer had five representatives on the All-SoCon Teams, including First-Team performers Tori Hedgecock and Hallie Langford. Catcher Sietske Drijvers earned Second-Team status, while rookies Grace Jones and Hannah Rivers claimed a spot on the league's All-Freshman Team.

In 2024, Mercer posted a 23-30 record and earned the No. 4 seed in the Southern Conference Tournament after posting an 11-10 league mark. The Bears placed four players on the All-SoCon Teams, including Hedgecock, who was a First-Team All-SoCon honoree in addition to securing a spot on the NFCA All-South Region Third Team.

The Bears authored a 20-37 record in 2023, including an 8-10 mark against league opponents, after earning 16 victories during Gettins' inaugural season at Mercer.

A native of Hastings, New Zealand, Gettins spent the 2021 season as a volunteer assistant coach at Texas. The Longhorns finished with a 43-14 record and reached the NCAA Super Regionals. She mentored Janae Jefferson, who became the third player in Texas history to secure NFCA All-America accolades.

Gettins opened her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Jacksonville during the COVID-shortened 2020 season.

Gettins split her college playing career between Florida Southwestern and Alabama, spending two seasons at each school. She was crowned as the NJCAA Division I National Pitcher of the Year in 2017 after posting a 34-1 record with a 1.50 earned run average and three saves across 220 innings.

In two seasons at Florida Southwestern, Gettins compiled a 73-7 record while making 91 appearances, including 75 starts. She fashioned a 1.38 earned run average and nailed down six saves while striking out 518 hitters over 553.1 innings.

Gettins enjoyed similar success at Alabama, furnishing a 20-7 record in two seasons with the Crimson Tide. In her initial campaign in 2018, she was 14-5 with a 2.46 earned run average across 26 outings. She became the first pitcher in Alabama history to throw a no-hitter in her debut after blanking Lamar in a five-inning effort.

Gettins graduated from Alabama in 2019 with a bachelor's degree in human environmental sciences.

Josh Eurich will serve as an assistant coach for the Volts during the 2025 Athletes Unlimited Softball League season.

Eurich, who is completing his senior year at Oklahoma State, has served as a student manager for the softball program over the last three seasons. His duties include serving as a batting practice pitcher and bullpen catcher while working with the pitching staff.

During each of Eurich's first two years, the Cowgirls have advanced to the NCAA Women's College World Series. During the 2023 season, Oklahoma State fashioned a 47-16 record and placed third in the Big 12 Conference before compiling a 49-12 mark last year.

During the last two summers, Eurich has also traveled with the USA Women's National Elite Team as the primary batting practice pitcher and bullpen catcher.

Originally from Sebewaing, Mich., Eurich competed for the United States Junior Men's National Team when he was 16 years old. He was a member of the roster for the Pan American Games in Guatemala.

Eurich is scheduled to graduate from Oklahoma State this spring with a bachelor's degree in agribusiness and will pursue a master's degree in interdisciplinary studies.

Serving as an assistant coach during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League season, Kristen Zaleski's experience of playing and coaching at the professional level will be an asset to the Volts.

Zaleski, who finished her third season as an assistant coach on the University of Texas staff earlier this spring, has guided the Longhorns to the NCAA Tournament in each of her three campaigns.

Under Zaleski's guidance, Texas closed the 2024 campaign with a 55-10 record and a No. 2 national ranking after reaching the NCAA Women's College World Series. She also mentored freshman outfielder Kayden Henry, who earned a spot on the All-Big 12 Conference Second Team in addition to Big 12 All-Freshman Team plaudits.

Zaleski also played a key role in helping the Longhorns' student-athletes work on their mental health during the season, which included winning the Big 12 regular season title. For its efforts, the Longhorns' coaching staff was recognized as the NFCA Division I Central Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

In 2023, Zaleski guided the Texas offense to a .325 batting average while belting 52 home runs with 326 runs batted in. Five different student-athletes on the roster accumulated 50 or more hits, including a team-high 75 hits from sophomore Mia Scott.

Prior to joining the Texas staff, Zaleski spent the 2022 season as a volunteer assistant coach at the University of Oklahoma. The Sooners won their sixth NCAA Division I title while holding the No. 1 national ranking for the entire season.

In addition, the Sooners paced the nation in several statistical categories, including batting average (.371), earned run average (1.05), home runs (155), on-base percentage (.474), runs per game (9.34), walks (268) and shutouts (33).

Zaleski served as the head softball coach at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi from 2020-21. After having the 2020 campaign halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Islanders registered 18 victories in 2021, marking their highest single-season win total in five years. The squad also established a program record by recording five consecutive shutout victories from March 19-24, 2021

Before taking over at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, Zaleski was the head softball coach at Temple College for nine seasons, piloting the Leopards to a 413-127 record, including a 237-47 mark in North Texas Junior College Athletic Conference play. The Leopards won five NTJ-CAC titles in addition to securing the 2018 NJCAA Division I national championship.

A three-time NTJCAC Coach of the Year honoree, Zaleski and her staff was recognized as the 2018 NJCAA Division I Coaching Staff of the Year.

In addition to her duties at Temple College, Zaleski was an assistant coach for the Dallas Charge during the 2016 National Pro Fastpitch (NPF) season. She worked primarily with the outfielders and hitters in addition to serving as the first base coach as the Charge compiled a 20-30 record.

Zaleski opened her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Texas State during the 2006 season, helping the Bobcats secure a 34-22 record with a second place finish in the Southland Conference standings.

A two-time All-NPF Team selection, Zaleski played five seasons in the NPF, including three years with the Texas Thunder (2004-06) and two years with the Rockford Thunder (2007-08). She was honored as the 2005 NPF Player of the Year after guiding the Thunder to a 35-12 record and a berth in the NPF semifinals.

Zaleski, who also earned NPF All-Star recognition three times across her five seasons, earned a spot on the United States National Training Team in 2006.

A four-year letter winner at Texas State from 2001-04, Zaleski earned a pair of Second-Team NFCA All-America certificates in addition to being named Southland Conference Player of the Year as a junior and senior. She stands as the first softball player in Texas State history to be inducted into the "T" Association Hall of Honor.

The Bobcats' all-time leader with a .386 batting average, Zaleski also owns the top spot on the program's career charts for runs scored (168), hits (291), triples (21) and stolen bases (128), while her 426 total bases are good for second in program history. In addition, Zaleski's 291 career hits are also the most in Southland Conference history.

Zaleski, who earned All-Southland distinction all four years, also holds six Texas State single-season records, including batting average (.440), at-bats (206), hits (81), triples (8), total bases (132) and stolen bases (39).

Zaleski, who earned her bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Texas State in 2004, also excelled in the classroom and earned CoSIDA Academic All-America® honors twice, including a First-Team nod as a senior.
