**The Quick Story:** The Blaze (5-13) utilized home runs from infielders **Ana Gold** and **Devyn Netz** and outfielder **McKenzie Clark** to power their way to a 10-2 victory against the Volts (6-12) to earn their first series victory of the year in Athletes Unlimited Softball League action at Husky Softball Stadium on Sunday afternoon.

**Key Moment:** The Blaze scored the first run for the fourth straight game after a solo home run from infielder **Ana Gold** gave them a 1-0 lead ... The Volts manufactured a run in the bottom of the fourth inning to tie the contest, but the Blaze scored the next nine runs to take a 10-1 lead and hold on for the victory.

## BLAZE NOTES



- The Blaze scored the first run of the game for the seventh time this season, including the fourth straight contest ... They are now 3-4 when plating the game's first run.
- The Blaze finished with 10 hits to mark the sixth time this season they have registered 10 or more base knocks in a contest.
- The Blaze lead-off hitters were 5-for-7 in the victory, while they were 10-for-18 in advancement opportunities.
- The Blaze's three home runs marked a new season high ... They had previously belted two homers in a contest three times.
- With victories on Saturday and Sunday, the Blaze won back-to-back games for the first time this season.
- Infielder **Aubrey Leach** drew her league leading 14th and 15th walks of the season in the first inning ... The free pass ran her streak of reaching base safely to 10 games
- Infielder **Ana Gold** launched her second home run of the season to lead off the top of the second inning ... It is her first home run since a two-run shot against the Bandits on June 23 ... The Duke product finished a perfect 3-for-3 at the plate with a season high four RBI and also scored twice.
- Outfielder **McKenzie Clark** wrapped up her weekend against her former team with a three-run home run in the fourth inning ... She finished the three-game set with a pair of homers, four RBI and two runs scored ... She has reached base safely in five straight games.
- Utility player **Aliyah Binford** tallied another pair of hits to finish the weekend 3-for-5 at the plate after joining the team after the mid-season break.
- Outfielder **Korbe Otis** registered her seventh multi-hit performance after a 2-for-3 effort at the plate in Sunday afternoon's victory ... She
- Pitcher **Keilani Ricketts** entered in relief in the third inning and shut down the Volts bats ... She tossed 3.0 innings and allowed just one run on one hit with four strikeouts to earn her first victory of the season.
- Pitcher **Alana Vawter** did not factor into the decision but held the Volts to one hit in 2.0 innings of work in the start.
- Utility player **Aby Vieira** made her AUSL debut as a defensive substitution at catcher in the seventh inning.

## VOLTS NOTES



- The Volts initiated a coach's challenge in the top of the sixth inning to review if outfielder **Aliyah Andrews** was out of the running lane on a close play at first ... The challenge was successful as the call was overturned and Andrews was ruled out.
- The Volts matched a season low with three hits in Sunday's defeat ... They were previously held to three hits by the Talons on June 21 and July 8.
- The Volts finished 1-for-11 with runners on base, including an 0-for-4 mark with runners in scoring position.

- The 10 runs surrendered by the Volts marks the most runs they have allowed this season ... The mark surpassed the eight runs scored by the Talons in back-to-back games on June 22 and 23.
- Catcher **Dejah Mulipola** launched her first home run of the season with a homer in the seventh inning ... It is just the second home run by a Volts' hitter in their past five outings.
- Utility player **Mia Scott** went 1-for-3 in the series finale with a single in the first inning ... She has reached base safely in eight straight games.
- Infielder **Sierra Romero** laced her fourth double of the season in the bottom of the fourth inning ... She has doubled in back-to-back games.
- Pitcher **Mariah Mazón** started in the circle but did not factor into the decision ... She allowed one run on two hits in 2.0 innings.
- Utility player **Sam Show** was saddled with the loss despite allowing just one hit, which was a home run, and dropped to 0-2 on the year.
