**DIDN'T SKIP A BEAT:** The Talons opened their AUSL title defense with a championship series rematch, picking up a 5-2 Opening Day home victory over the Bandits. Utah looks to claim a series victory and their fifth-straight win over the Bandits across AUSL regular season and postseason play.

**OFF TO A FLYING START:** Infielder **Bri Ellis** started her second season for the Talons with a career day at the plate. After collecting eight hits and one home run in 21 games in 2025, Ellis went 2-for-3 with a home run, double and three runs batted in to collect her first mult-hit game of her AUSL career.

**NO RELIEF NEEDED:** Pitcher **Montana Fouts** started off the 2026 AUSL season the way she ended the 2025 campaign - with a complete game victory over the Bandits. After clinching the 2025 title with a 1-0 shutout victory, Fouts allowed two runs over seven innings and struck out four Bandits to earn the Opening Day win. After allowing two runs on three hits to the Bandits in the first inning, the Alabama product scattered five hits over six scoreless innings to close out the game.

**SKIPPER'S FIRST VOYAGE:** Head coach **Cindy Ball-Malone** picked up her first win at the helm of the Talons with Tuesday's Opening Day victory. In addition to her 1-0 coaching record in the AUSL, Ball-Malone has compiled a 391-264-4 career record across 12 seasons at UCF and Boise State.

**TWO-WAY STREET:** Pitcher **Sarah Willis** is set to make her Talons debut in the circle on Wednesday. Willis made nine appearances for the Bandits during the 2025 AUSL season, authoring a 1-1 record with a 6.59 earned run average. The UCF product has also done damage at the plate during her softball career, going 2-for-6 with a double and home run during the 2024 AUX season and compiling a .251 batting average during her college career.

**JAX OF ALL TRADES:** Outfielder **Jadelyn Allchin**, nicknamed Jax, established herself as one of the Talons' most dangerous offensive threats in 2025. The UCLA and Washington product led the team and ranked third in the AUSL with a .483 on-base percentage while tying for the league lead with a perfect 8-for-8 on stolen base attempts. She also ranked second on the team in batting average (.380), slugging percentage (.580) and home runs (3) while also earning All-Defensive Team honors with a .974 fielding percentage.

**RUNNING IT BACK:** Nine members from last year's AUSL Championship team return to the roster for the 2026 campaign. Outfielders **Jadelyn Allchin** and **Caroline Jacobsen**, infielders **Bri Ellis** and **Hannah Flippen**, utility player **Sahvanna Jaquish** and catcher **Sharlize Palacios** combined to post 97 hits with 12 home runs and 63 runs batted in last year. Meanwhile, pitchers **Georgina Corrick**, **Montana Fouts** and **Megan Faraimo** combined for 106.2 innings last summer with 91 batters and 3.35 earned run average.

**WALL OF THE WASATCH:** The Talons' defense backed up its pitching staff en route to winning the inaugural AUSL title last summer. Utah led the league in fielding percentage with a .980 mark, committing just 13 errors in 24 regular season games. Five Talons were named to the AUSL All-Defensive Team, headlined by Defensive Player of the Year **Hannah Flippen**, with four of the five (Flippen, **Jadelyn Allchin**, **Georgina Corrick**, **Sharlize Palacios**) returning to the team in 2026.

**SOMETHING'S BRUIN:** The Talons have five players on the 2026 roster who finished their collegiate softball careers at UCLA, including both of the team's draft picks in the 2026 College Draft. Pitcher **Megan Faraimo** (2019-23), catcher **Sharlize Palacios** (2023-24), outfielder **Jadelyn Allchin** (2024), infielder **Jordan Woolery** (2023-26) and pitcher **Taylor Tinsley** (2023-26) all starred for the Bruins. The Westwood connection extends to the Talons' staff as general manager **Lisa Fernandez** and assistant coach **Will Oldham** also serve on UCLA's coaching staff.

**RED, WHITE AND BLUE:** Six Talons were among the 36 players named to the U.S. Women's National Team Athlete Pool, which is tied for the second-most among AUSL clubs. Outfielder **Jayda Coleman**, pitcher **Megan Faraimo**, infielder **Hannah Flippen**, pitcher **Montana Fouts**, utility player **Sahvanna Jaquish** and catcher **Sharlize Palacios** are eligible to compete in the 2026 International Cup from July 30-August 3 and the 2026 WSBC Women's Softball World Cup Group Stage from September 12-16.

**PLENTY OF TRAFFIC:** The Bandits opened the 2026 season with eight hits in the series opener against the Talons, but were limited to two runs despite outhitting Utah by a 8-5 margin.

**COFFEL COLLECTS:** Infielder **Erin Coffel** wasted little time getting back into form after her MVP campaign, recording a multi-hit effort in the season opener for two of the team's eight hits.

**FIRST TIME OUT:** Pitcher **Odicci Alexander-Bennett** threw 2.0 shutout innings in relief in the season opener on Tuesday, less than five months after giving berth to her second child, Halo, on January 18.

**ONE STEP AWAY:** The Bandits reached the AUSL Championship Series last season after finishing second in the standings with a 15-9 record.

**CHAMPIONSHIP REMATCH:** The Bandits are looking to spoil the Talons' championship celebration as the opening series of the season features a rematch from the 2026 AUSL Championship Series. The Bandits tallied just six total hits in two games en route to a pair of 3-1 and 1-0 losses.

**HOT STARTS:** The 2025 season saw the Bandits jump out to a blistering start to the year, opening the season with a 9-2 record in the first 11 games. The lone two losses both came at the hands of the Talons, including a 6-3 loss on June 8 and a 5-4 setback on June 18.

**FOUR SCORE:** In 2025, the Chicago Bandits finished the regular season with a perfect 12-0 record when holding opponents to four runs or less.

**YOUTH IN THE CIRCLE:** The Bandits have just two returning pitchers from 2025 on their Opening Day roster, including **Odicci Alexander-Bennett** and **Taylor McQuillin**. **Bri Copeland** will have a chance to step into the pro spotlight for the first time in her career this weekend while **Mariah Lopez** and **Amber Fiser** can make their first appearances for the Bandits.

**RETURNING TO THE TOP:** Infielder **Erin Coffel** returns to the field in Rosemont after being named the AUSL Most Valuable Player and Hitter of the Year last summer. Coffel led the league in slugging percentage (.877), on-base percentage (.570) and runs batted in (27).

**GOLDEN GLOVE:** In addition to being selected as the AUSL MVP and Hitter of the Year, infielder **Erin Coffel** was named to the AUSL All-Defensive Team in 2025 after recording a .987 fielding percentage with just one error in 76 chances for the Bandits.

**MULTIPLICATION TABLES:** Outfielder **Morgan Zerkle** was exceptional in 2025 with 14 multi-hit games, including five outings with three or more hits, while reaching base at a .440 clip.
