LEADING THE WAY: Starting pitcher **Sam Landry** leads all pitchers with over 10 innings pitched with a 1.11 ERA. Landry has appeared in six games, starting four games and completing three of them. In her six appearances, Landry has not given up more than two runs.

FULL STRENGTH AT LAST: The Cascade will begin their series at Texas with their full roster, after pitcher **Carley Hoover** and catcher **Mia Davidson** join Portland after completing their respective seasons in Japan.

GOING THE DISTANCE: Portland handed the reigning champions, the Utah Talons, their first and only three losses of the season, led by **Sam Landry, Kenzie Brown and Kelly Maxwell** who combined for 20.1 inning in their starts against the Talons, striking out a combined 17 batters while only giving up a combined four runs in the series.

A WINNING FORMULA: The Portland Cascade rattled off the second longest win streak in AUSL history with **Korbe Otis** batting in the leadoff spot. Over those five games Otis reached base in every game and batted in nine runs. The Cascade are 5-1 in the six games that Otis has led off.

A PLACE TO CALL HOME: Portland earned its first win at home in front of a sold-out crowd in the home opener. Starting pitcher **Sam Landry** became the second pitcher in AUSL regular season history to pitch a complete game shutout, joining **Georgina Corrick** who has accomplished the feat twice. .

RECIPE FOR SUCCESS: "Chef" **Megan Grant** may not be in college anymore, but after setting the NCAA record for home runs in a season (42) she is off to a hot start in the AUSL, with two home runs so far this season. .

THERE IS A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: In her debut performance in the AUSL, **Kenzie Brown** managed to secure the Cascade's first win in franchise history, pitching the full five innings and striking out a handful of Blaze batters. In her second performance, Brown became the first pitcher in AUSL history with double digit strikeouts in a game.

WHEN IT RAINS, IT POURS: The Cascade were able to find their groove in the second inning of the final game against the Blaze on their way to a dozen runs. The most runs scored in a single inning in AUSL history. Center fielder **Kendra Falby** contributed a pair of RBI singles, but the Cascade were led by **Korbe Otis**, who after hitting an RBI single in her first at-bat of the inning, capped the scoring with a grand slam in her second at-bat.

NOT TO BE TAKEN FOR GRANTED: After setting the single season home run record in her senior season at UCLA, **Megan Grant** hit a two-run home run in her second at bat with the Cascade which is the new longest home run in AUSL history at 313'.

A NEW FRANCHISE BUDS IN ROSE CITY: Portland is now home to franchises in three of the largest women's sports leagues. The Cascade join the Thorns (National Women's Soccer League) and the Fire (WNBA) as major women's franchises to call the City of Roses home.

PITCHING AT A PREMIUM: The Cascade used their first selections in the Expansion Draft and the Allocation Draft last December to select pitchers, choosing **Sam Landry** and **Kelly Maxwell**, respectively. Landry was the No. 1 overall selection by the Volts in the 2025 College Draft. Maxwell, meanwhile, piloted Team USA to a Gold medal at the 2025 World Games.

NEW LEAGUE, NEW RECORDS TO SET: **Megan Grant** was selected with the No. 4 overall pick in the 2026 AUSL College Draft after a record-setting career at UCLA where she set an NCAA record with 42 home runs as a senior and finished as the Bruins' all-time leader with 91 career home runs.

SUNDAY SOFTBALL MATINEE: The Texas Volts conclude their eight-game homestand on Sunday when they play host to the Portland Cascade at 12 p.m. at Dell Diamond in the final contest of a three-game set. The matchup is just the Volts' second day game of the year.

CHAPTER THREE: The Volts and Cascade meet for the third time in their histories with Portland leading the all-time series 2-0. The Portland Cascade are one of two Athletes Unlimited Softball League expansion franchises for the 2026 season.

EARLY TO RISE: The Volts have been particularly productive at the plate early in games this season. Twenty three of the team's 43 runs this season (53 percent) have come before the fourth inning. The Volts have scored 12 runs in third innings this season, which are the most of any inning.

FLY THE FRIENDLY SKIES: The Volts are tied for the AUSL lead with 16 home runs in 12 games this season. After hitting just eight total home runs in their first eight games, Texas has hit eight round trippers over the last four games. In this past Tuesday's game vs. Chicago, the Volts set an AUSL single-game record with five home runs. Two-way player **Aliyah Binford** is tied for the individual AUSL home run lead with five.

WHAT A CARD(A): Pitcher **Ally Carda** joined the Volts on June 23 from the Japan Diamond League. Carda, who is projected to make the start in the circle on Sunday, made her first start of the year in this past Wednesday's win against Chicago. Carda tossed 3.0 innings in her AUSL debut, allowing two hits and one earned run. Carda, one of the most veteran players in the AUSL, having concluded her collegiate career in 2015, brings extensive international experience to the Volts. Carda helped Team USA win the Silver medal at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, alongside current Volts General Manager **Cat Osterman**. Carda was a first-round selection of the Volts in the 2026 Allocation Draft.

THE INNER CIRCLE: **Aliyah Binford** is the AUSL leader in both total appearances (8) and relief appearances (7) in the circle this season. Binford sports a 2-1 record - earning both victories in the mid-week series vs. Chicago - and is tops on her team with a 1.78 earned run average. She has allowed the fourth-fewest runs in the league this season with eight.

DOING IT ALL: In addition to her work as a pitcher, **Aliyah Binford** is third on the Volts with a .306 batting average and is tied for the AUSL lead with five home runs. Binford has hit safely in eight of the Volts' last 10 games and nine of the squad's 12 games overall.

DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE: Utility player **Jackie Lis**, who has started the last two games at third base, has a double in each of the last two games for the Volts. Lis had not hit a double prior to this weekend's series. Lis, who joined the Volts from the AUSL Reserve Athlete Pool to start the 2026 season, played her senior season at Texas Tech after transferring from Southern Illinois. Lis hit .415 as a senior, helping the Red Raiders to their second consecutive Women's College World Series Championship Series appearance.

SAVE THE BEST FOR LASS: Outfielder **Jalia Lassiter** leads the Volts with two stolen bases this season, recording her second swipe in the last outing vs. Portland on June 27. Lassiter is 2-for-2 in stolen base attempts and the Volts are 4-for-6 in stolen base attempts overall. Texas' four stolen bases overall ranks third in the AUSL.

X-FACTORS: Three Texas Volts are among the four AUSL players selected to compete in MLBx: All-Star 3-on-3 in Philadelphia on July 12. **Tiare Jennings**, **Nijaree Canady** and **Rachel Garcia** will represent the Volts.

EVERYTHING'S BIGGER IN TEXAS: Five players are from the State of Texas: **Aliyah Binford** (New Braunfels), **Danieca Coffey** (Richwood), **Alyssa Denham** (Alvin), **Leighann Goode** (San Antonio) and **Jessica Mullins** (Tarkington).

COACH SPEAK: Multiple players on the Volts 2026 roster bring a coaching mindset to their roles as many have or are currently coaching at the collegiate level. Those with current or previous coaching experience include **Ally Carda** (Cal Poly San Luis Obispo), **Danieca Coffey** (Baton Rouge CC), **Alyssa Denham** (McNeese), **Rachel Garcia** (San Diego State), **Tiare Jennings** (Oklahoma) and **Jordyn Rudd-Lee** (Purdue).
